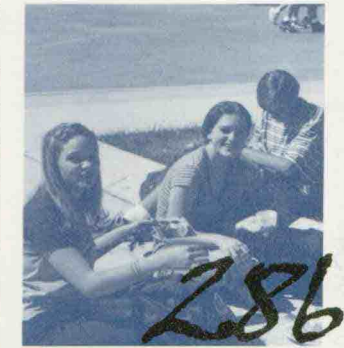

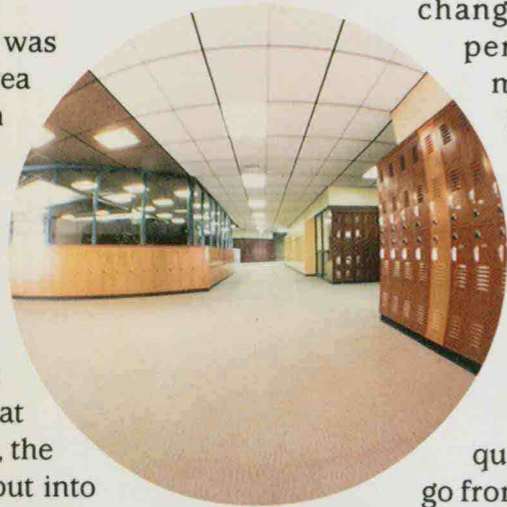

When Columbine was built, the surrounding area was vastly different than it is today. There was no Southwest Plaza, no Clement Park, and C-470 had yet to open.

CHS opened as a year-round school, with the entire student body never in session at the same time. In 1985, the present schedule was put into place, creating what current principal Frank DeAngelis calls, "a unity that had

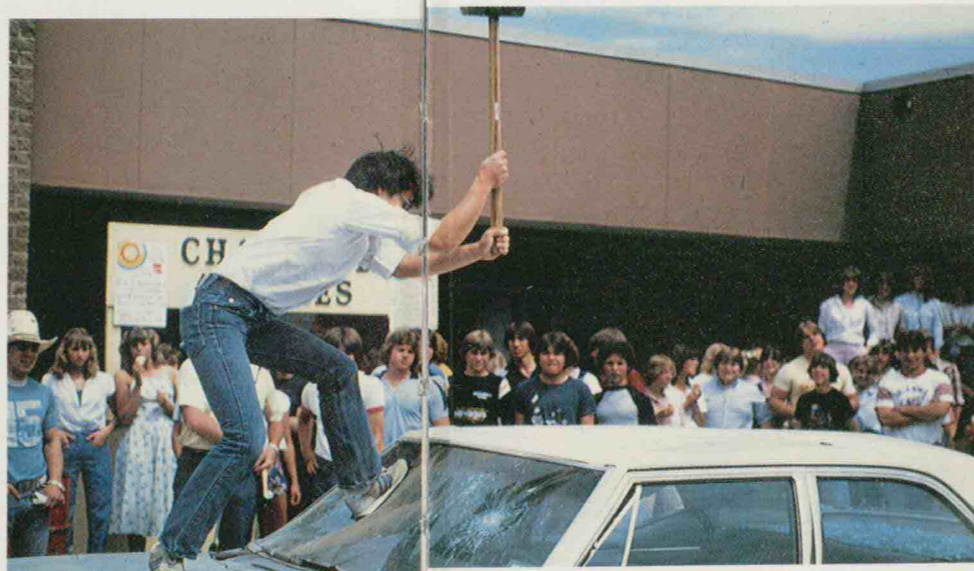


been lacking." Mr. DeAngelis has worked at Columbine since 1979.

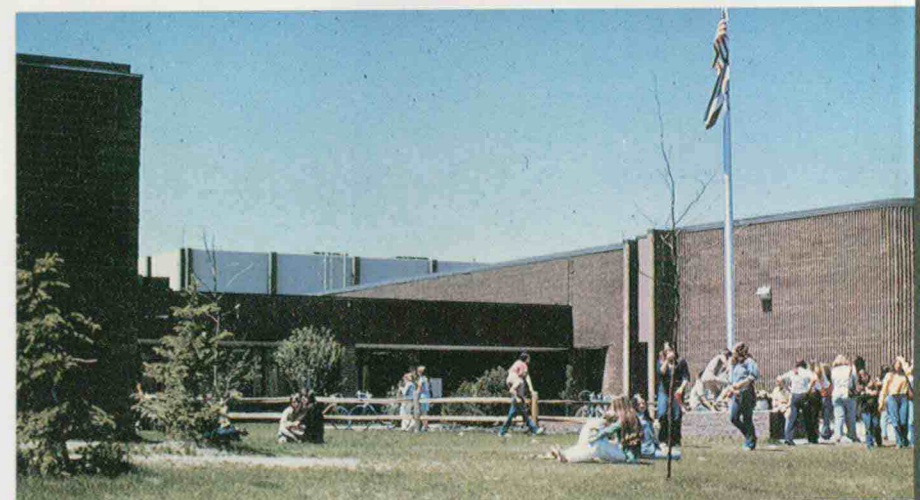

After all this, the question is, where do we go from here? All we know for sure is: there's more to come . . .

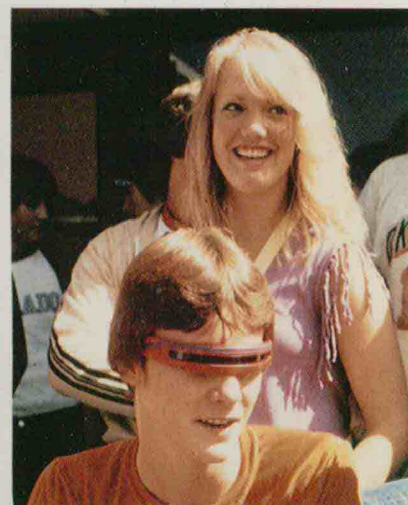

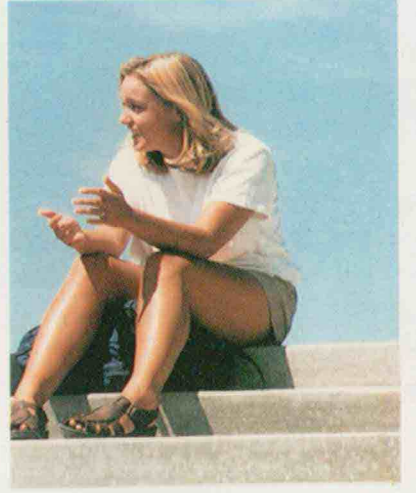
Students escape uniformity through diversity in activity

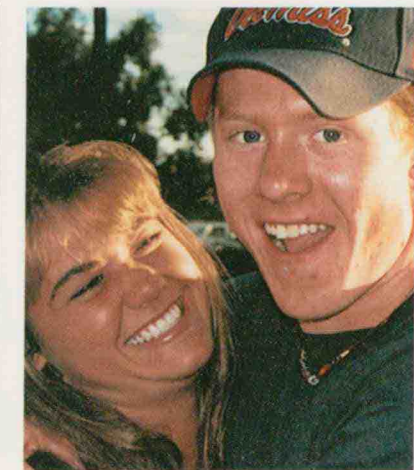

While games and competitions attracted spectators because of the field action, students also enjoyed the events as excuses for spending time with their friends. Senior Lauren Montgomery went

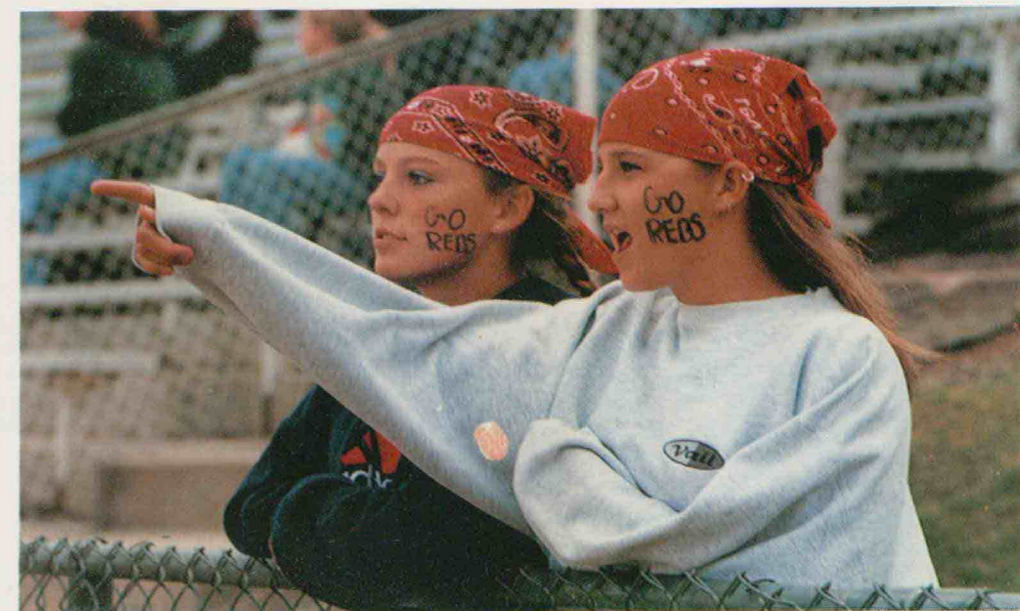

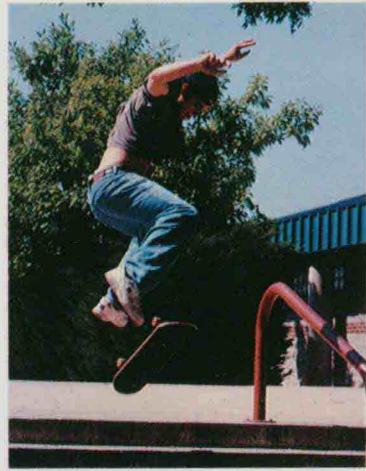

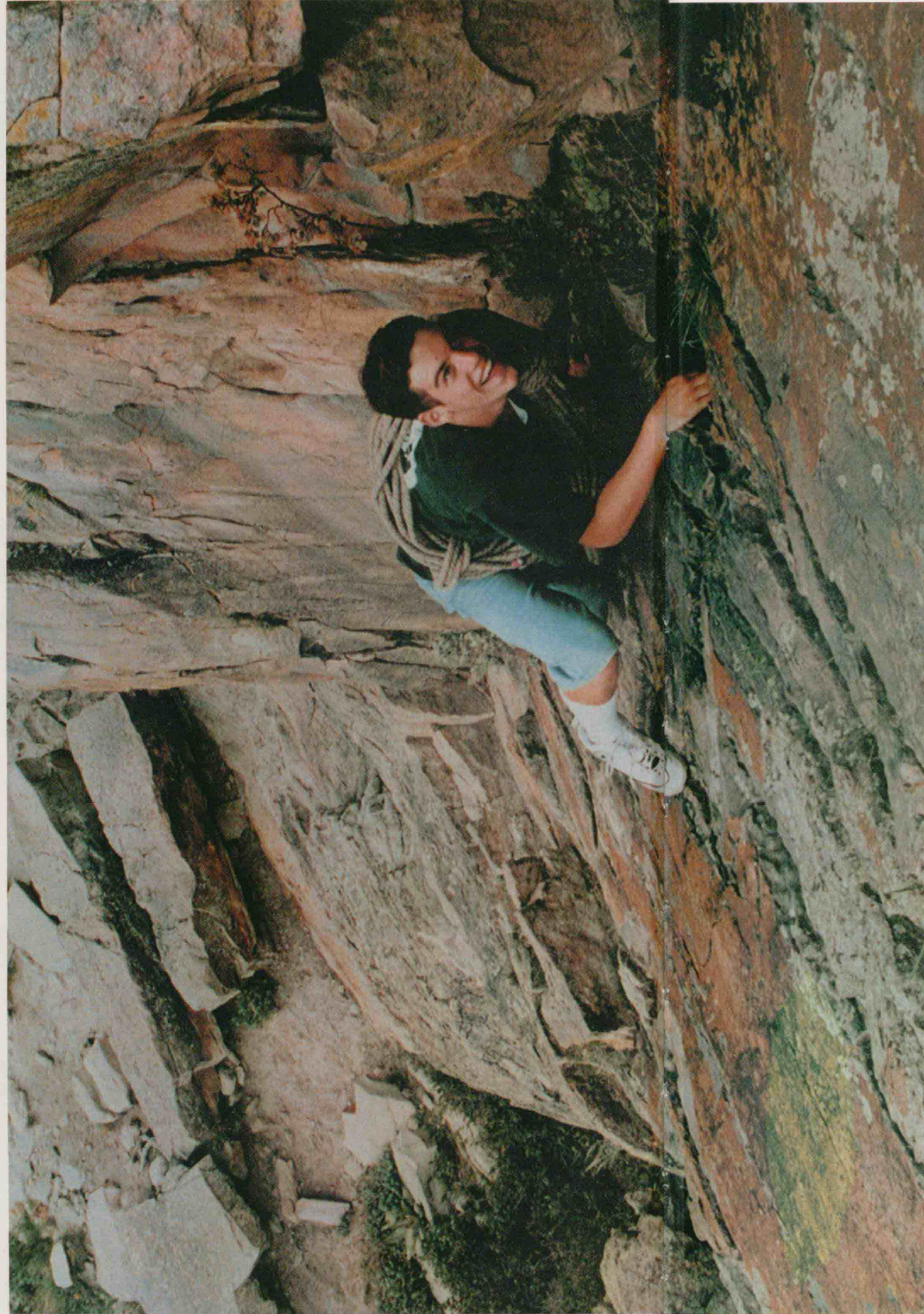

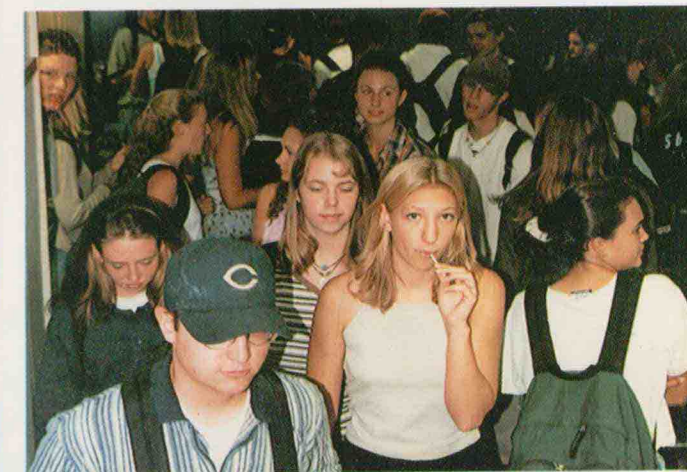

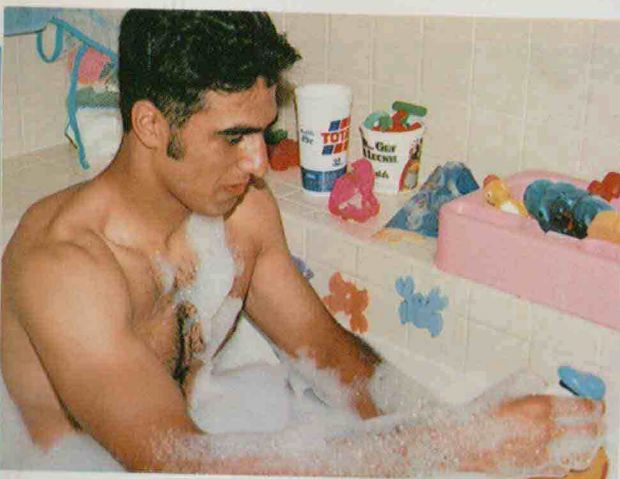

RUB-A-DUB-DUB

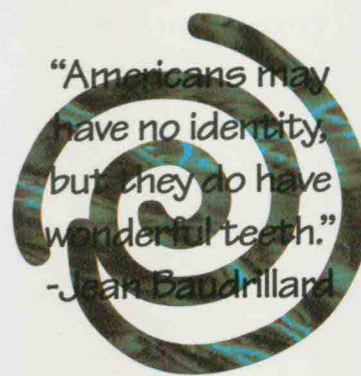
Though often just a routine habit, personal hygiene sometimes became an unusual method for students to express their personal styles.

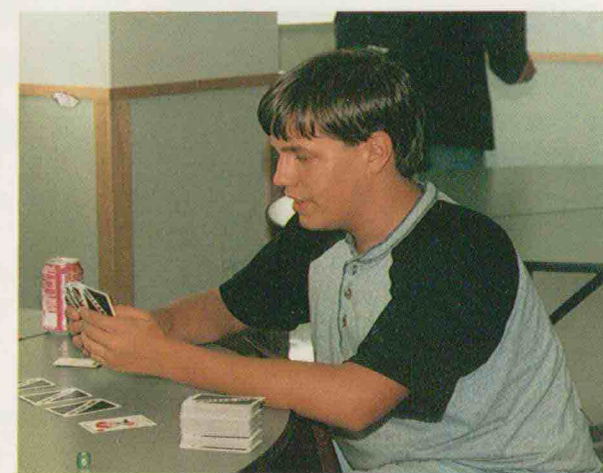
Sophomore Salli Melfi enjoyed performing arts and exclaimed, "I like to act, sing, and dance."

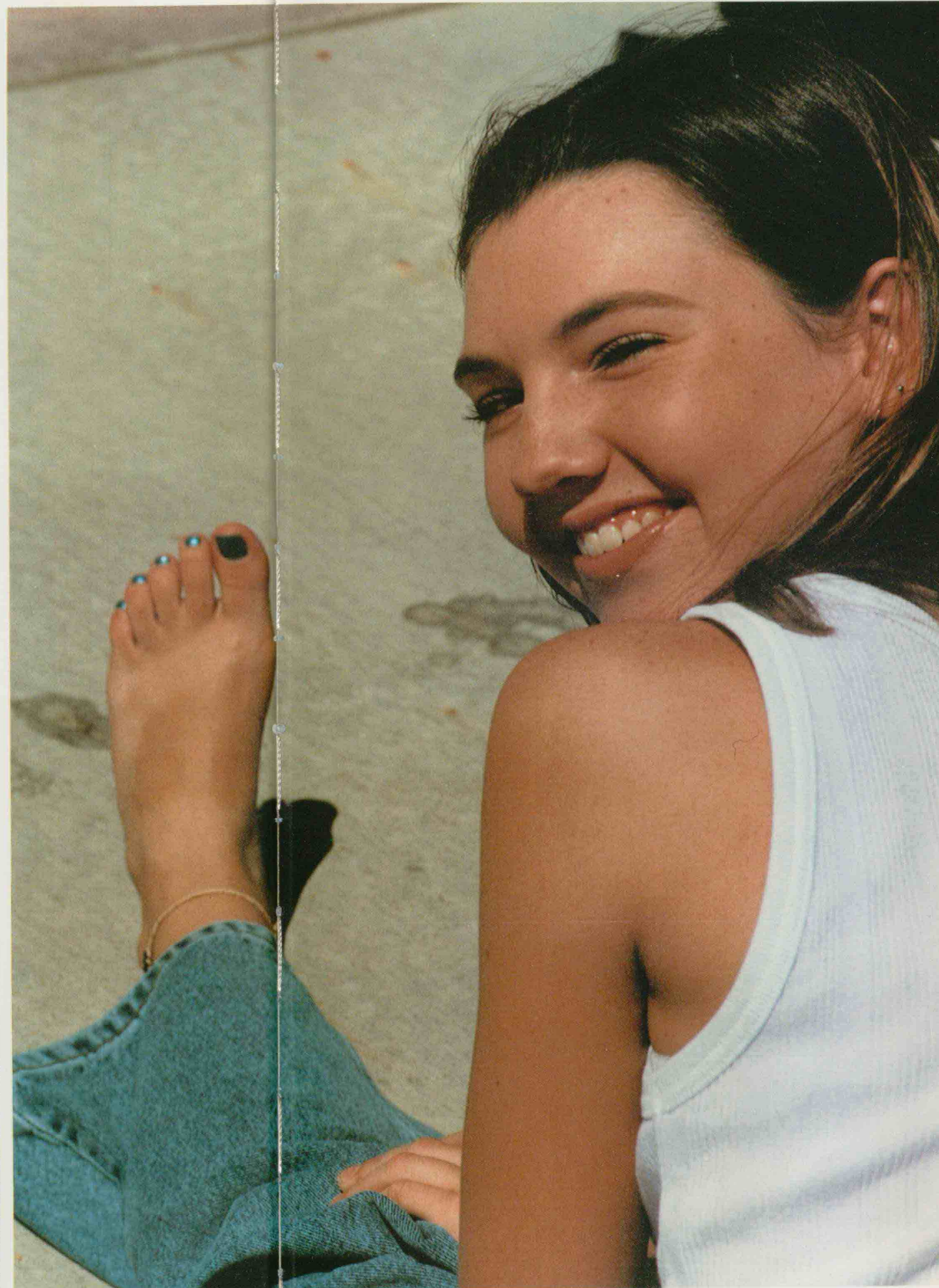

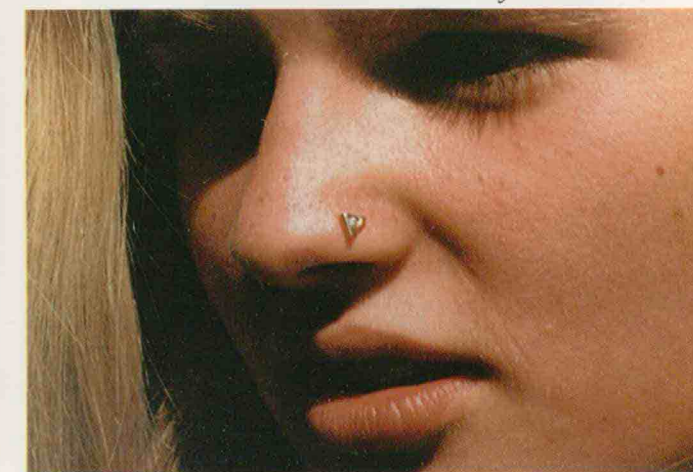

would get a giant red flame on my arm."

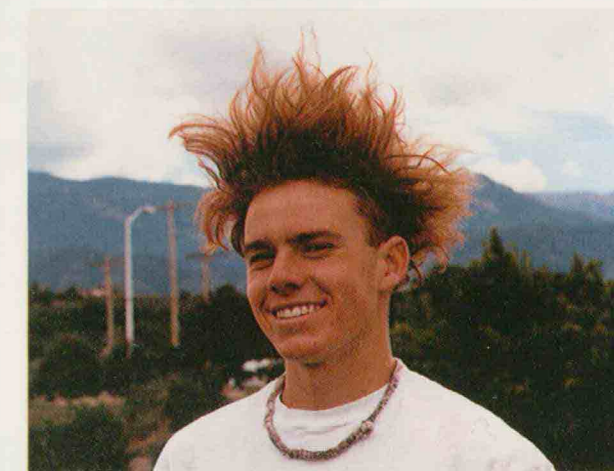

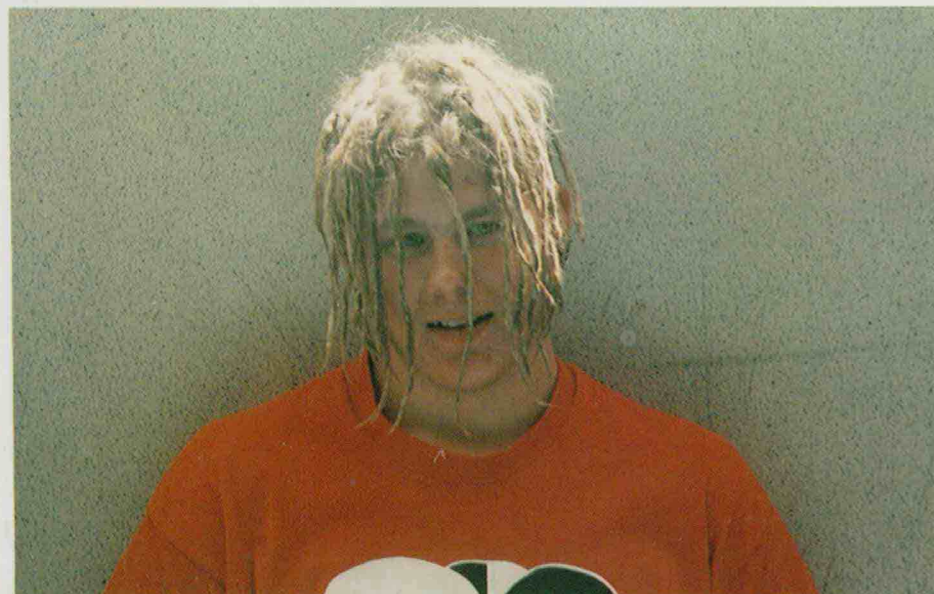

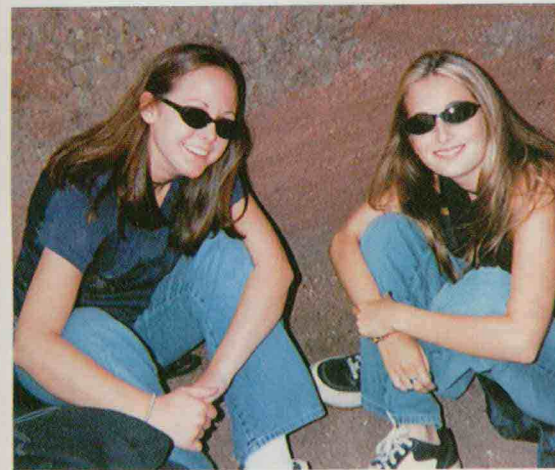

ANOTHER 48 HOURS

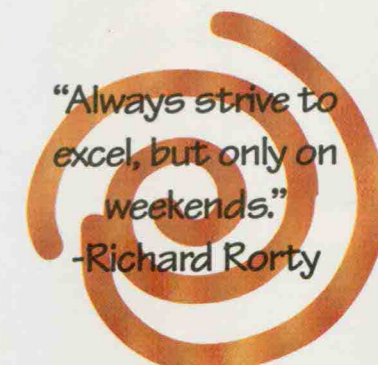
After long weeks of homework and tests, students looked forward to stress-free weekends when they could relax and have fun.

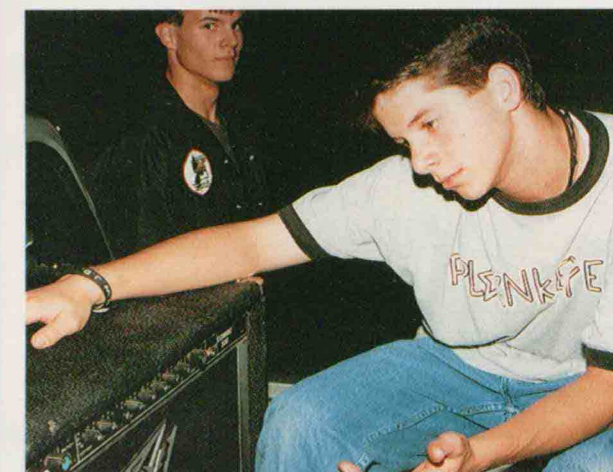

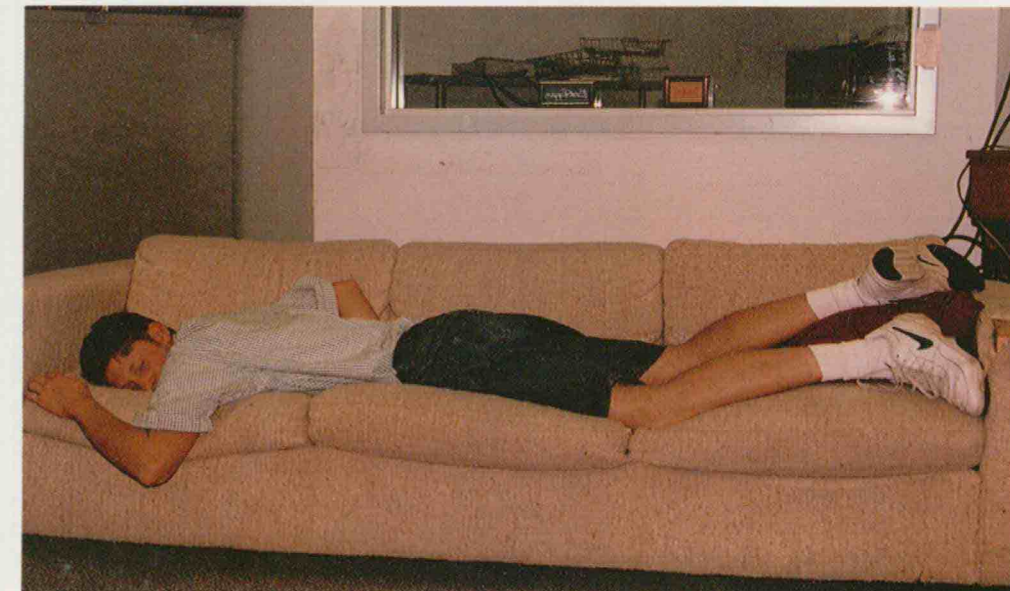

The Student Senators spent a week

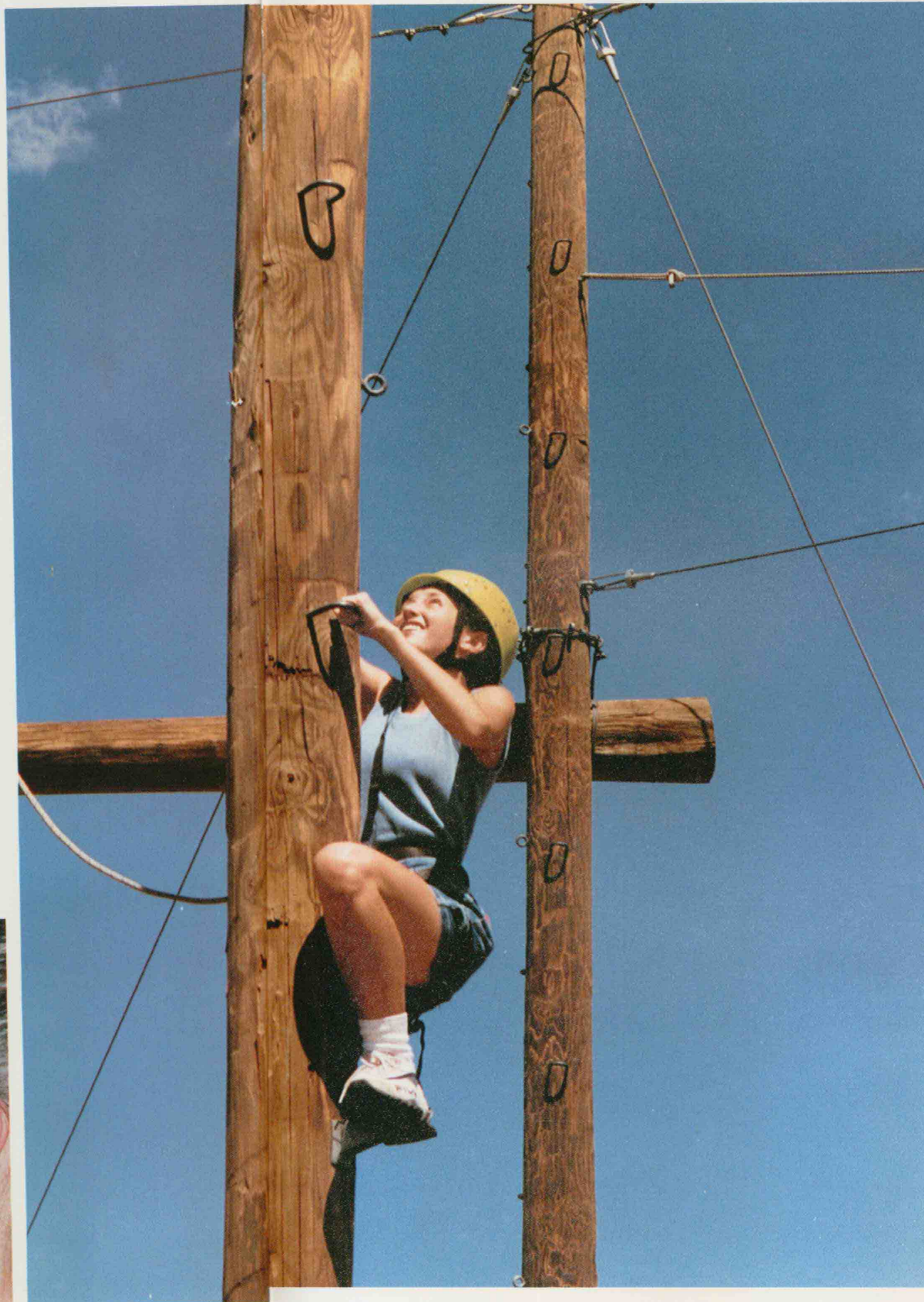
at Camp Wondervu planning for upcoming school activities. Junior Senator Kelly Dickson replied, "We set up many goals for the year at the retreat."

STUCK ON BAND-AIDS

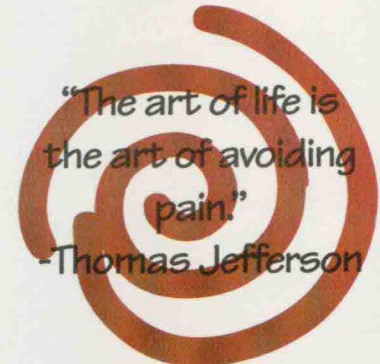
Ouch! The snap of a bone breaking. The ache of a pulled muscle. Several Columbine students experienced these feelings of pain and injuries.

Students were also injured outside of sports, as Junior Ryan Pool revealed. "I

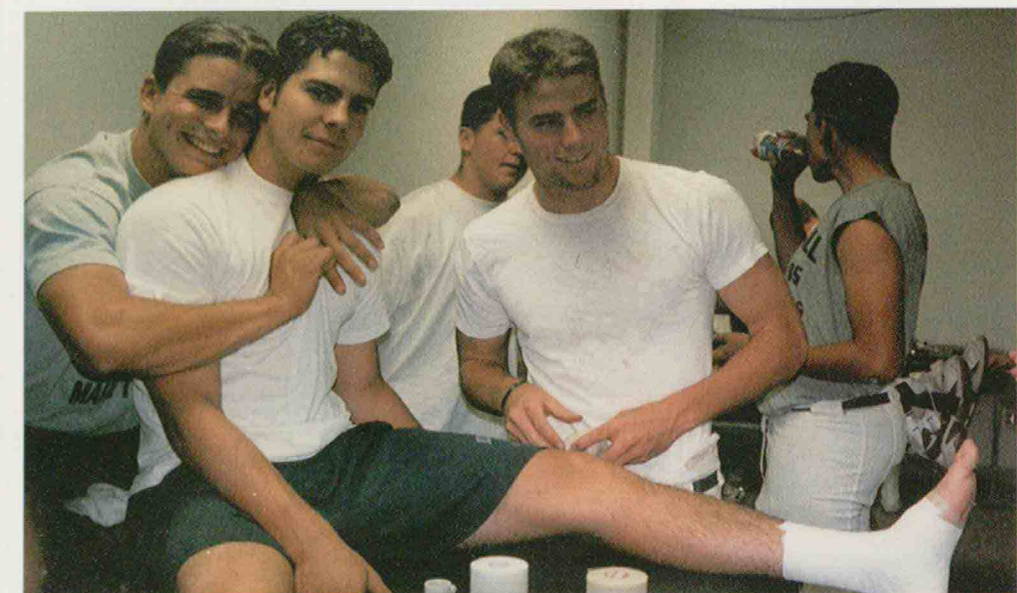

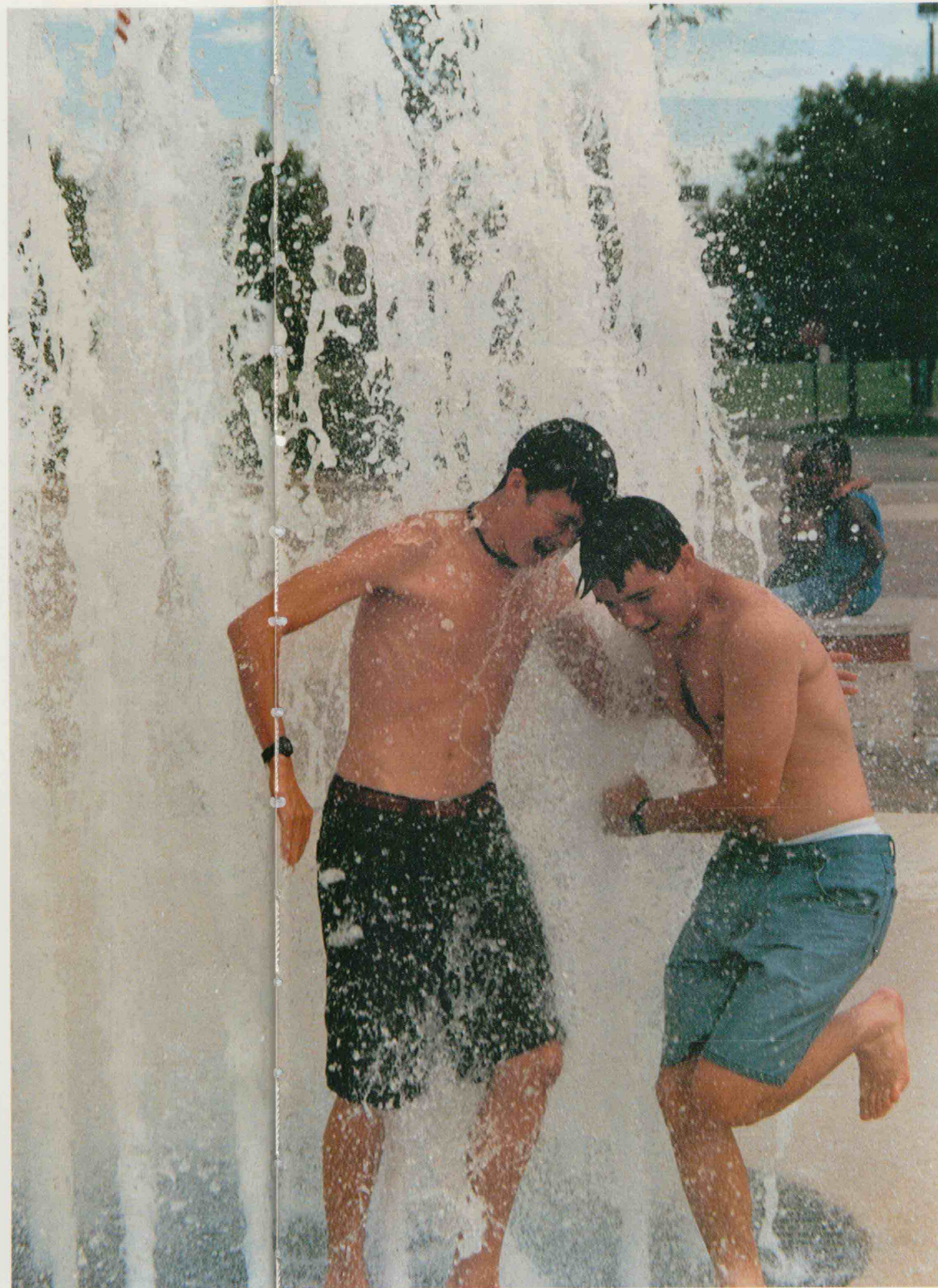

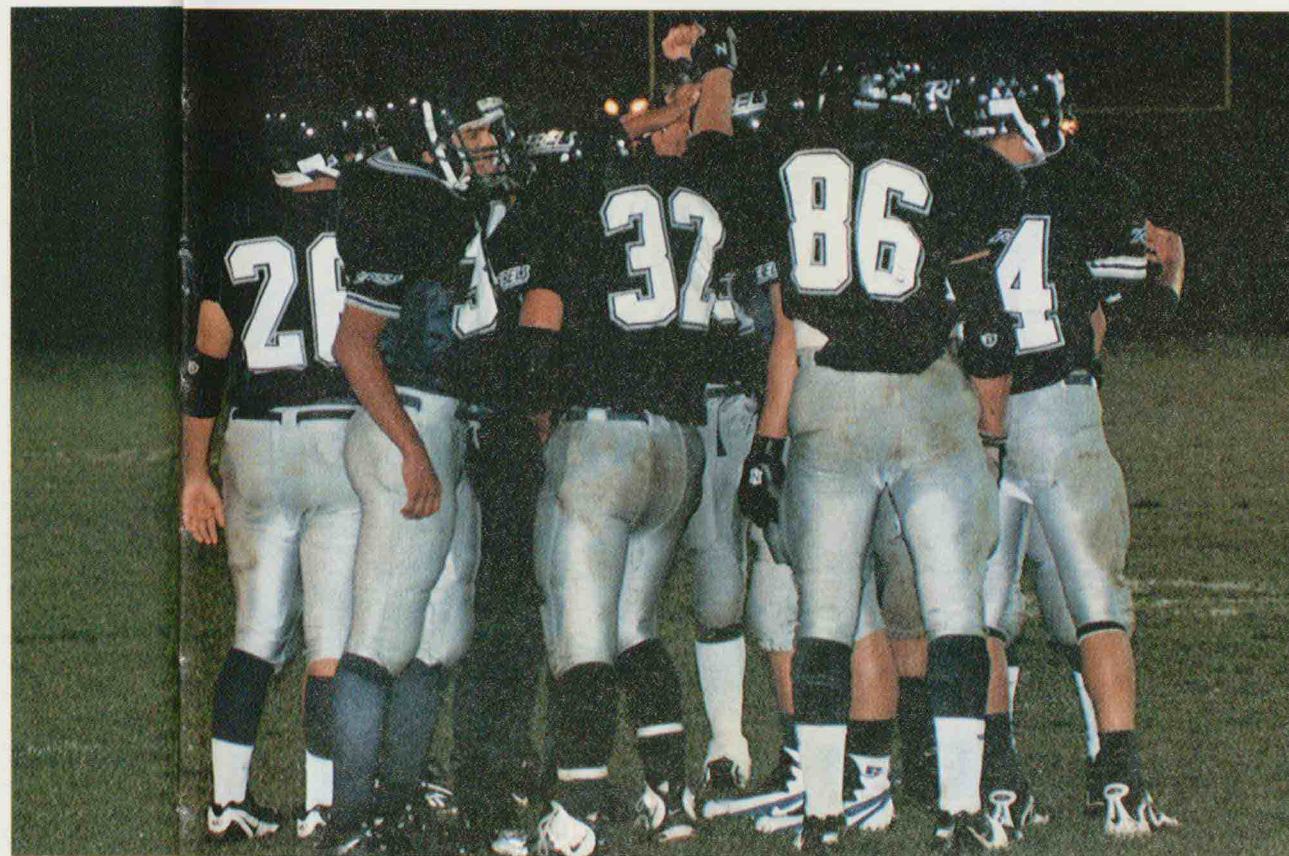

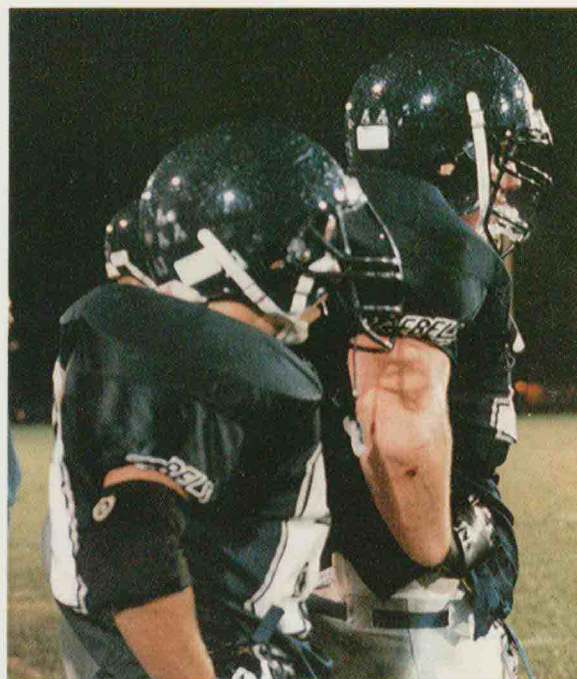

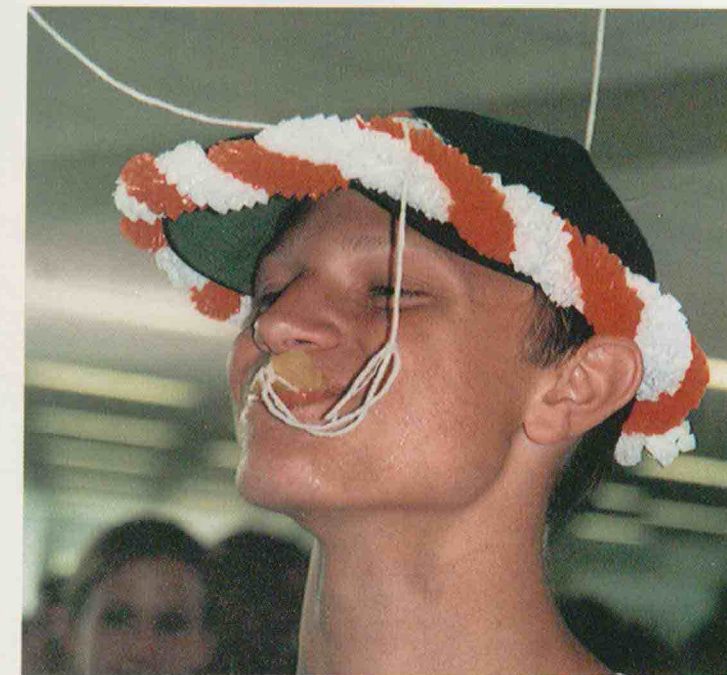

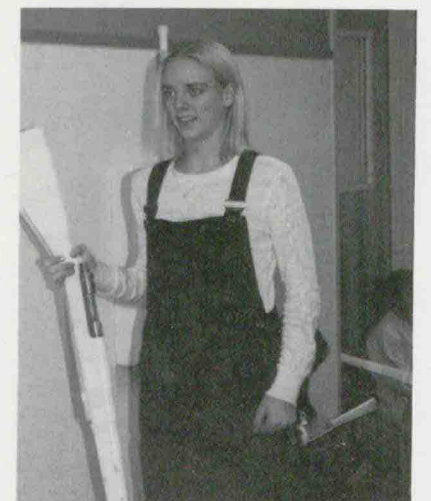
Students make their voices heard through performance

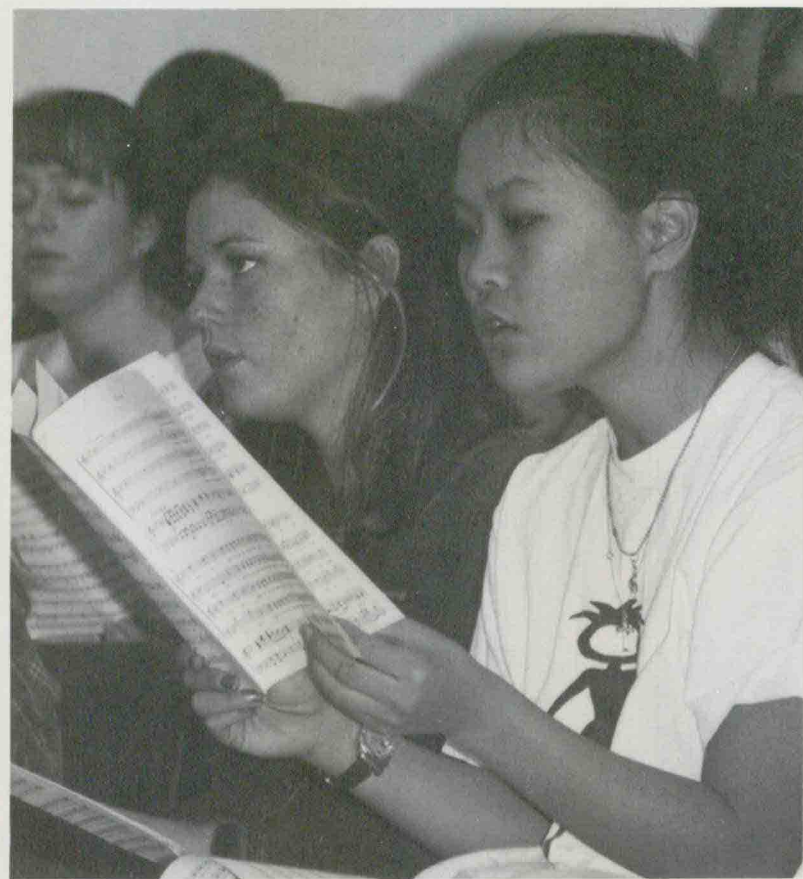

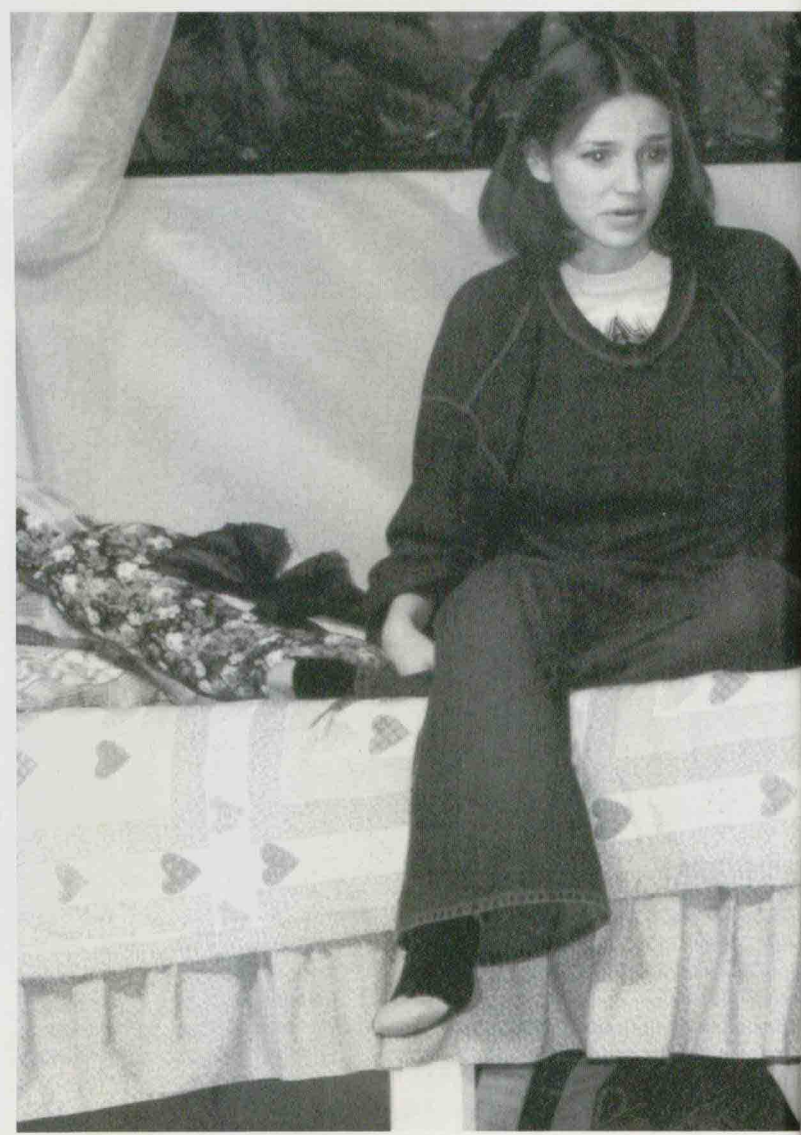
Putting on an Act

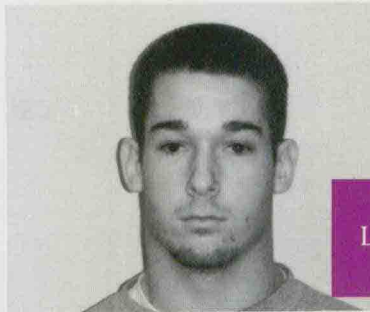

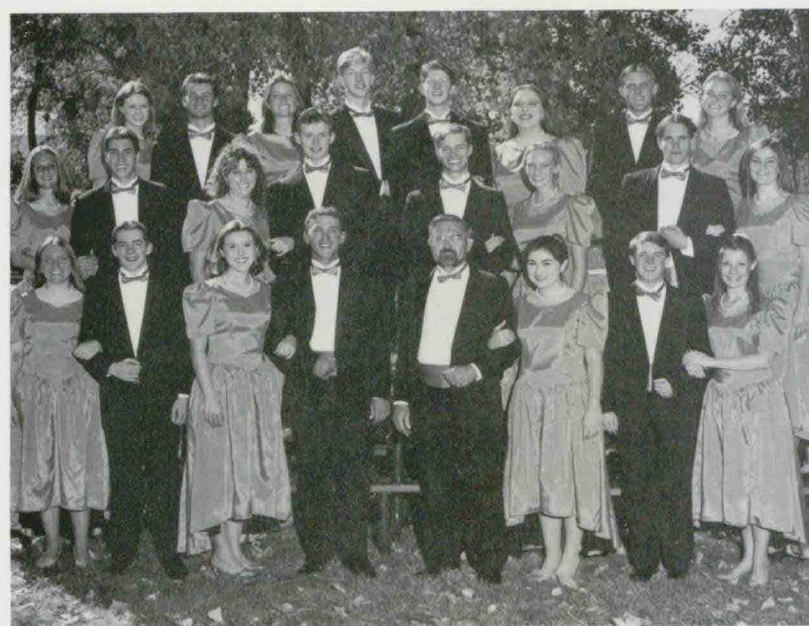

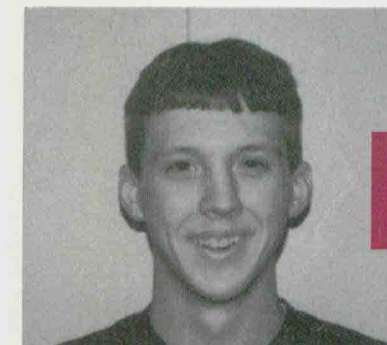
MARCHING

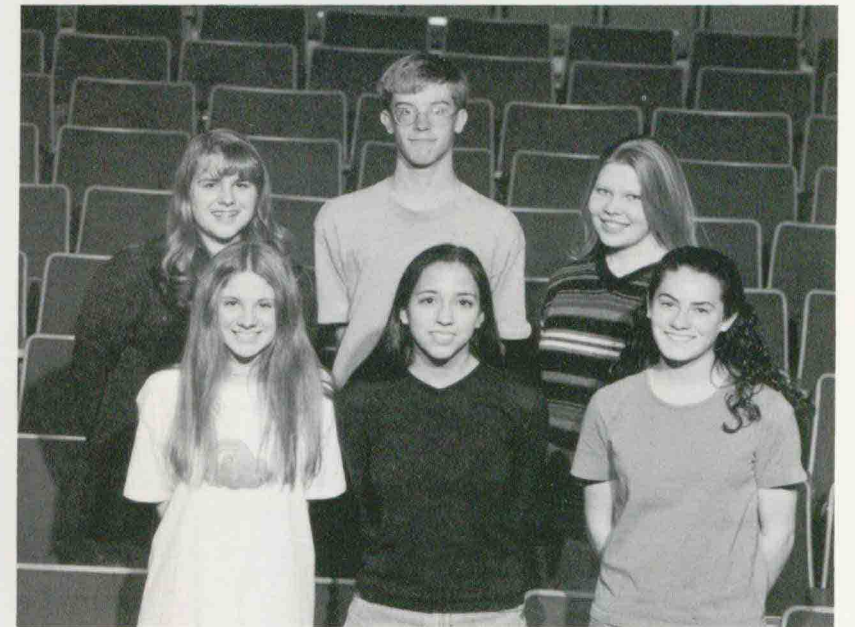

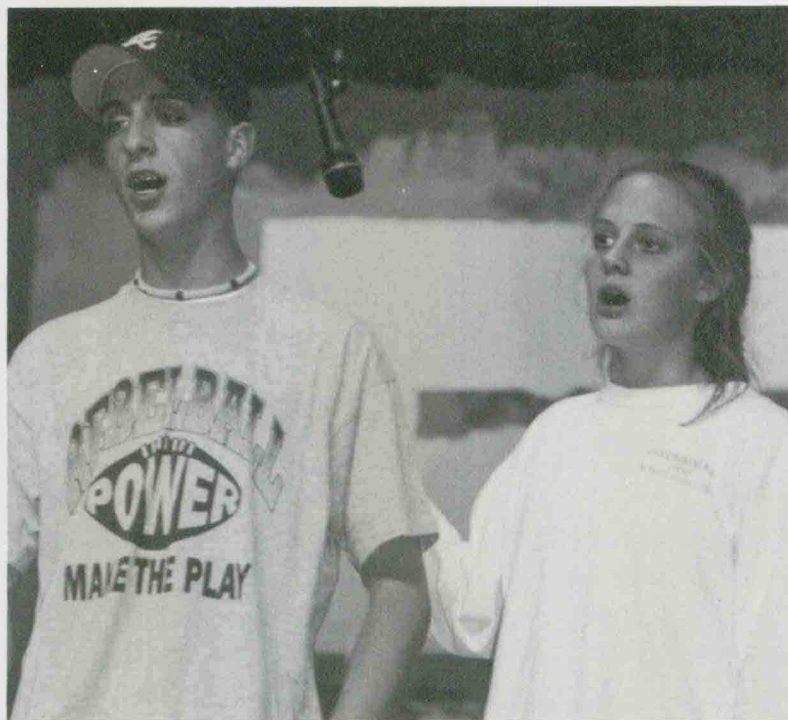

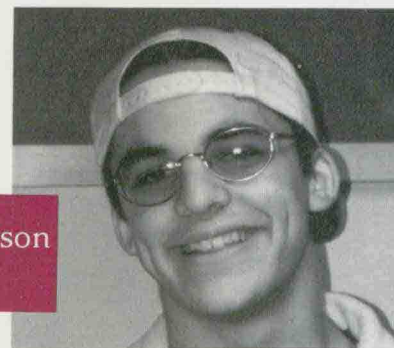

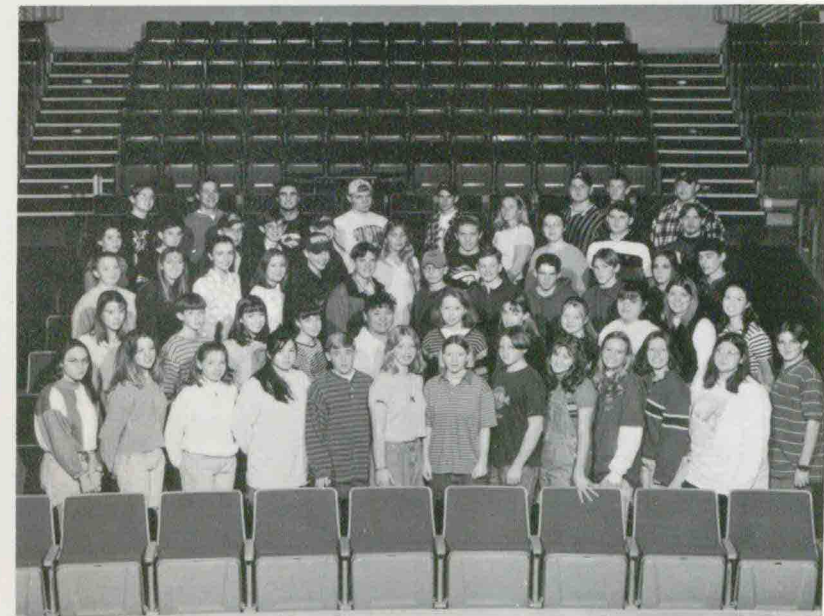
Instruments have voices, too

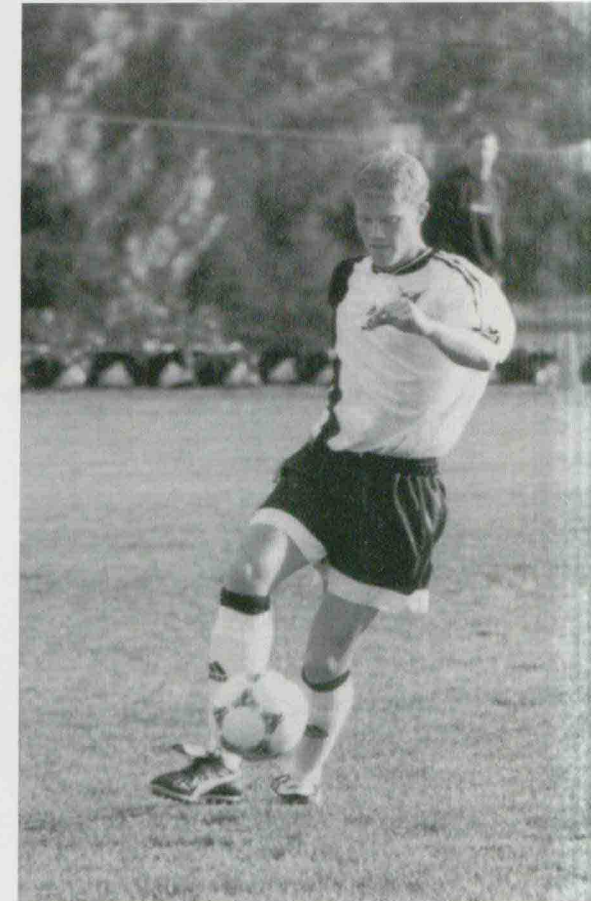

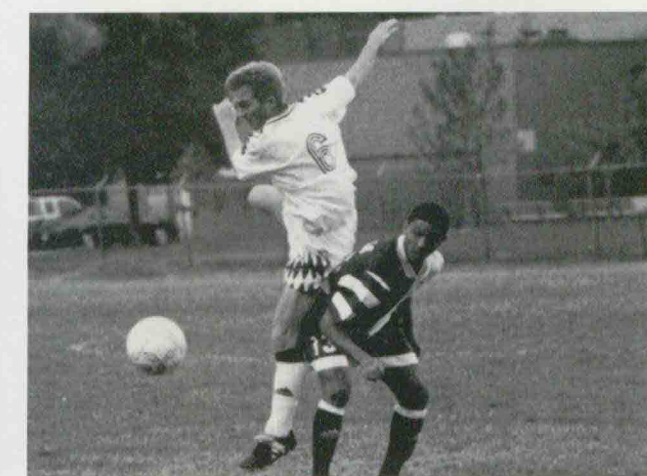

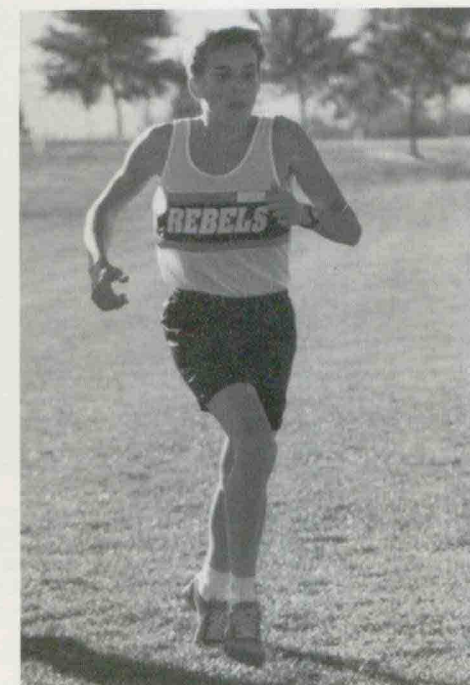

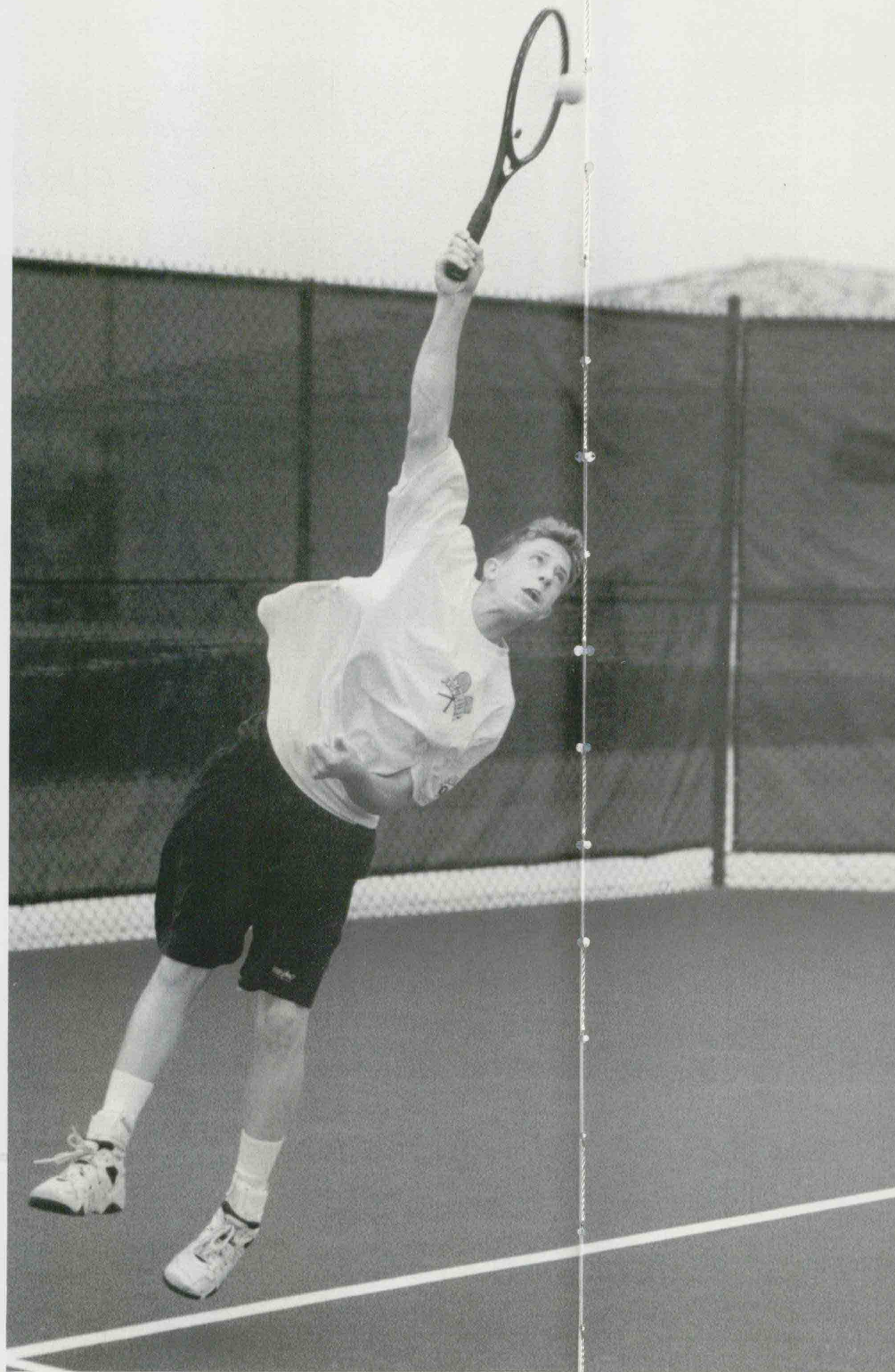

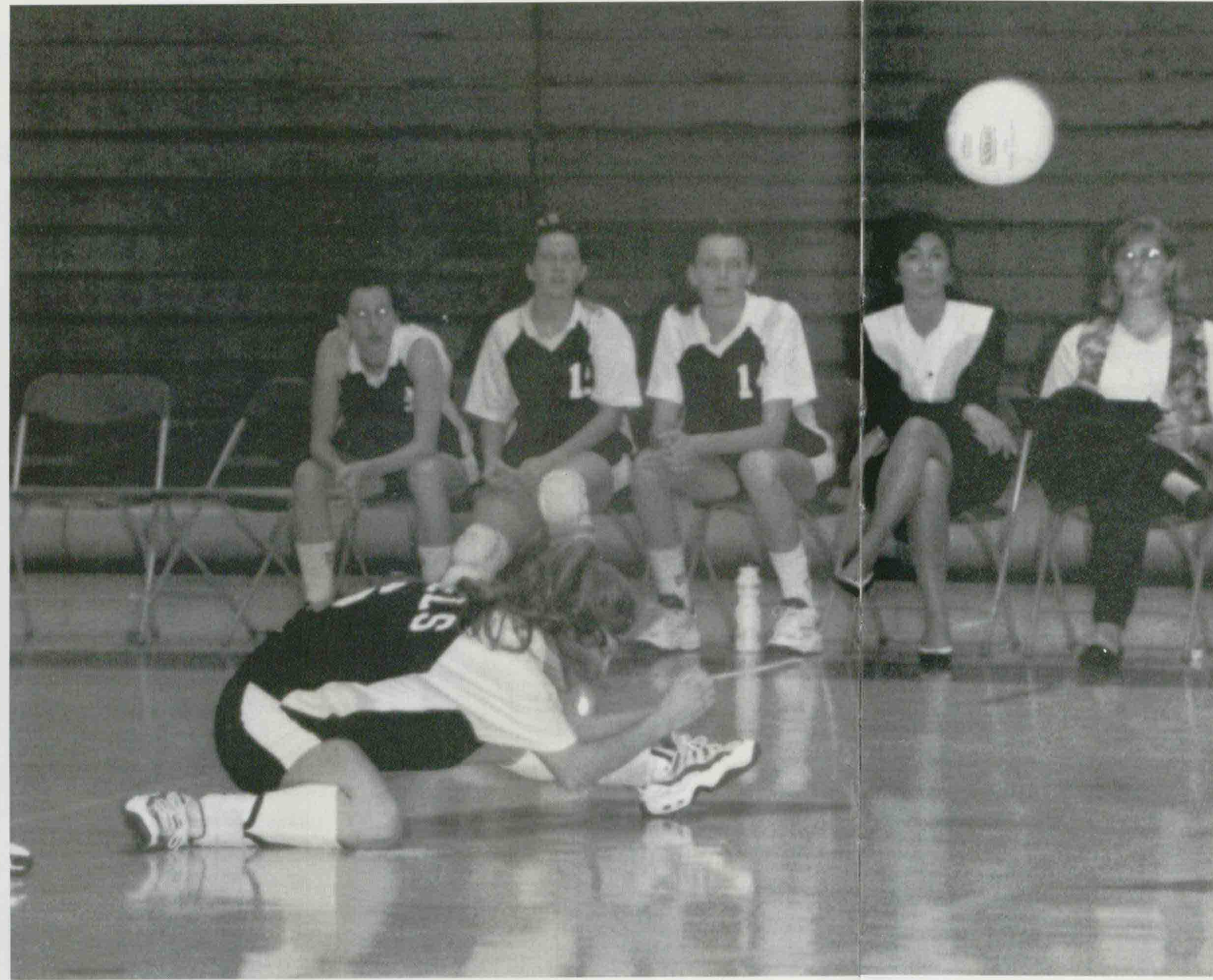

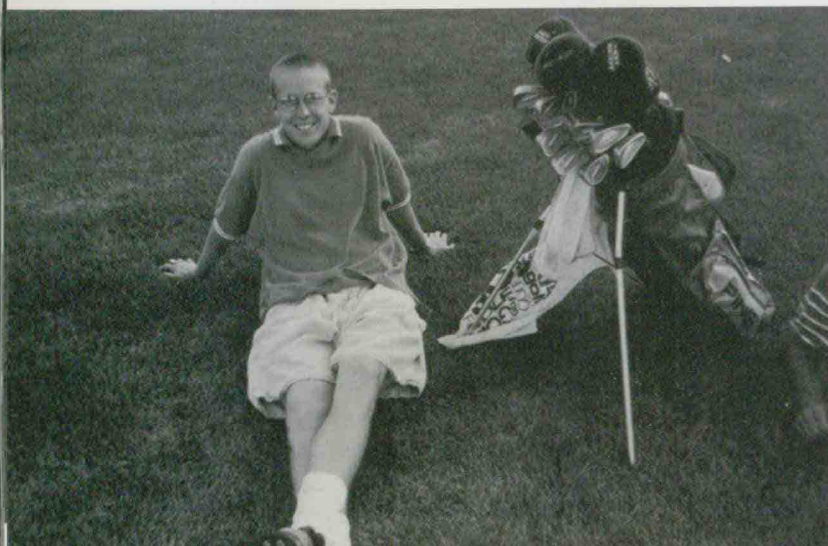

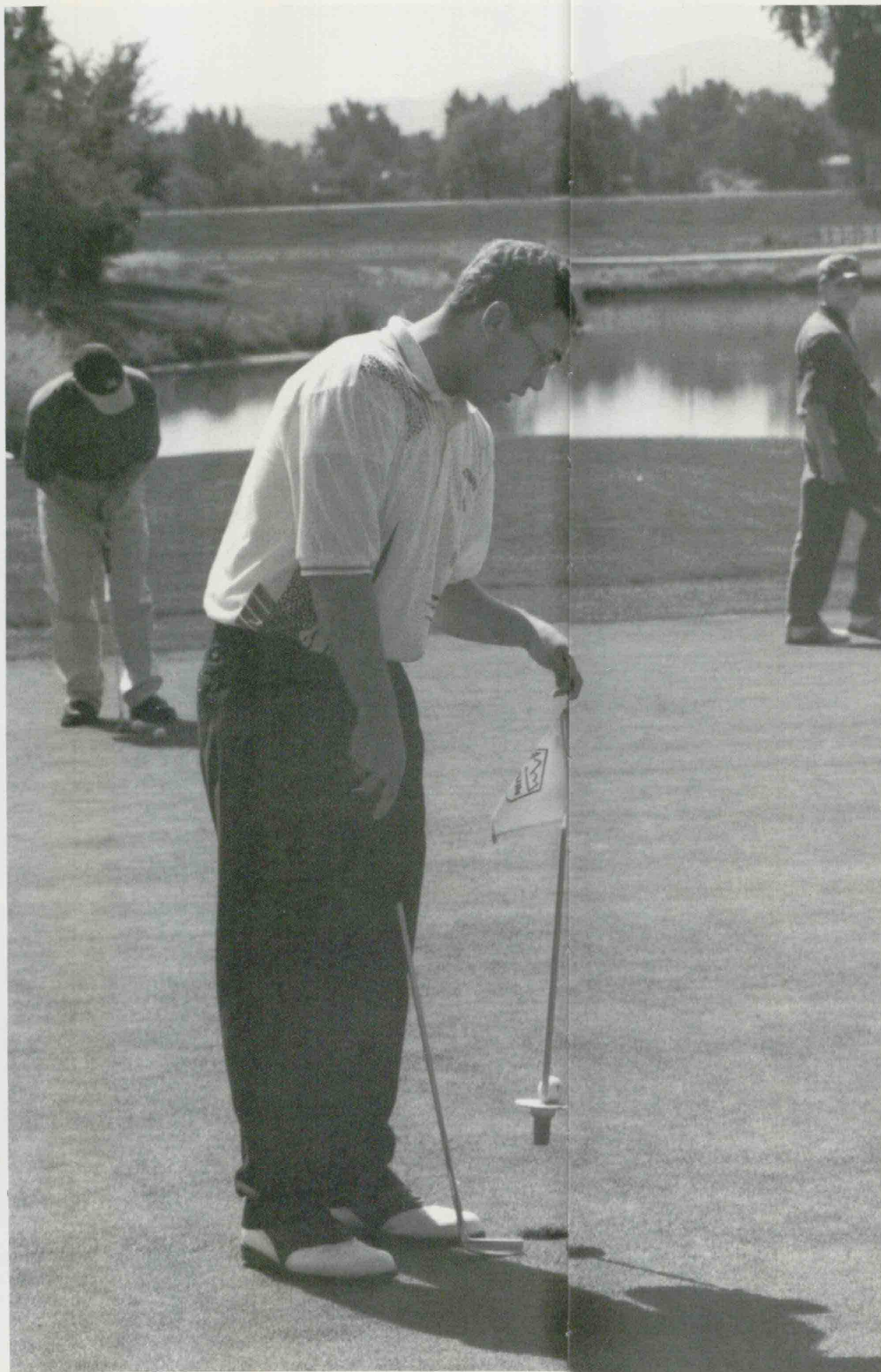

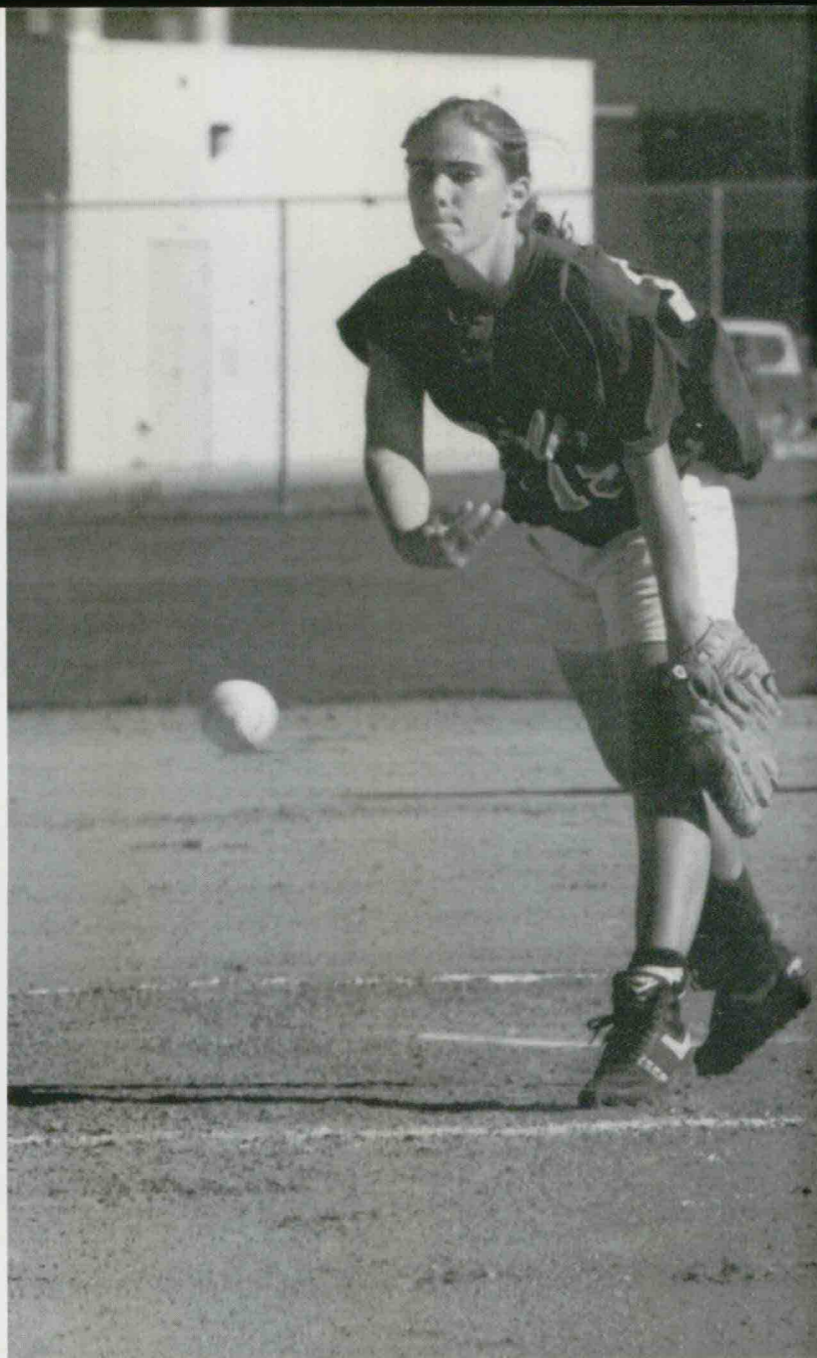

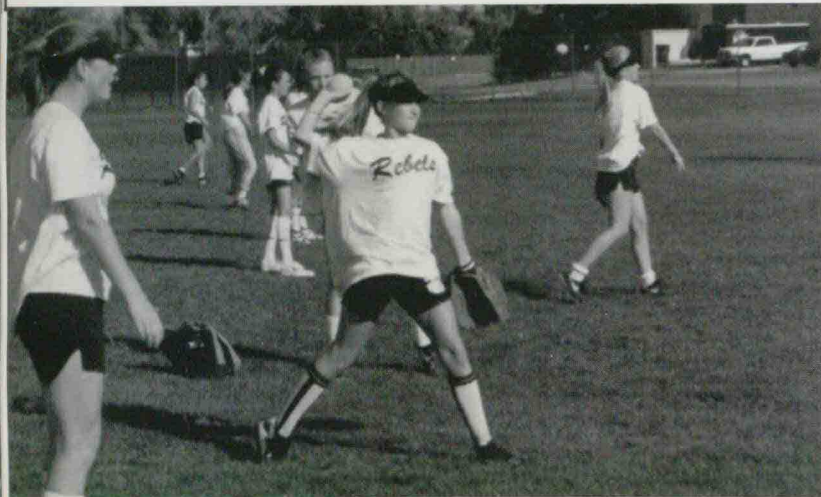

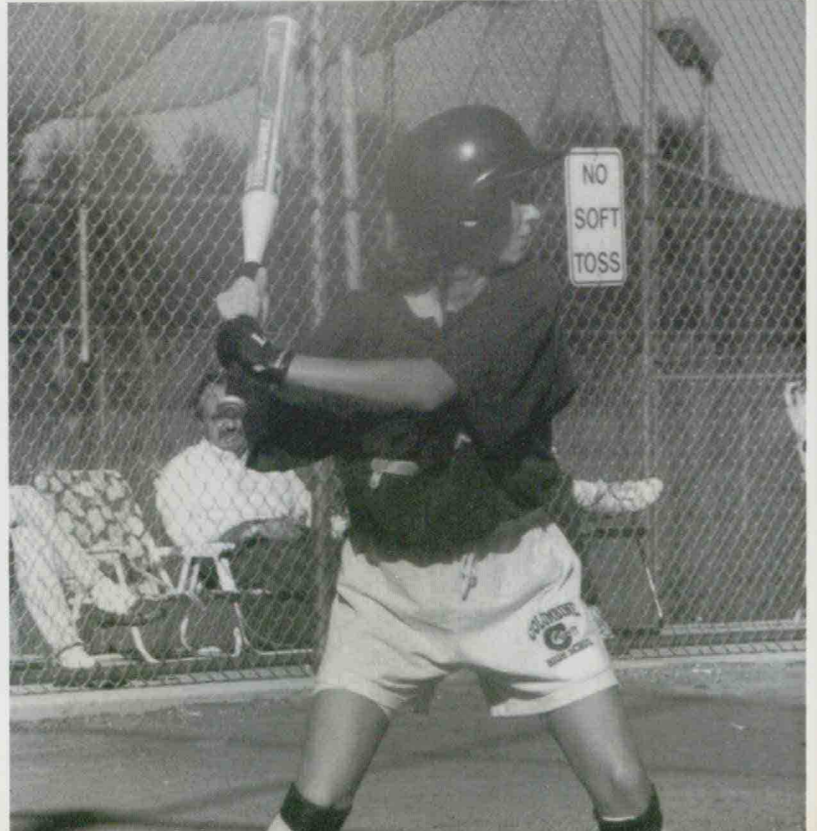

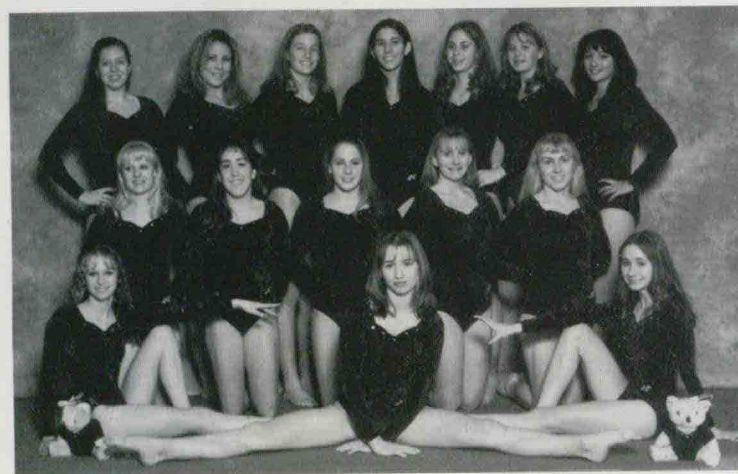

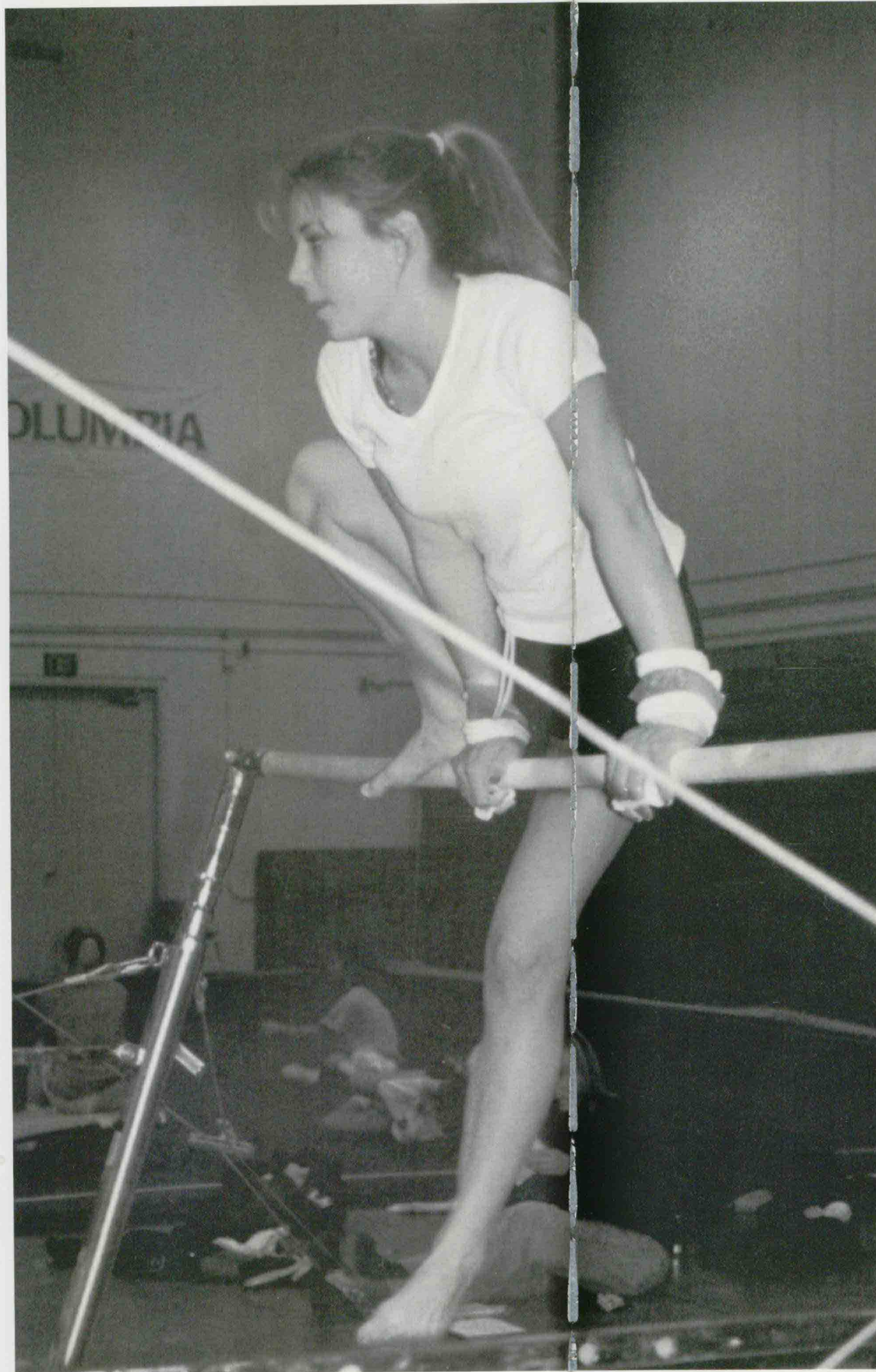

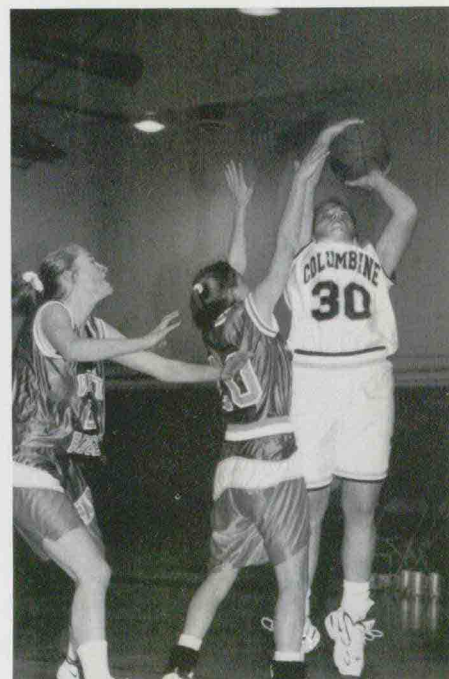

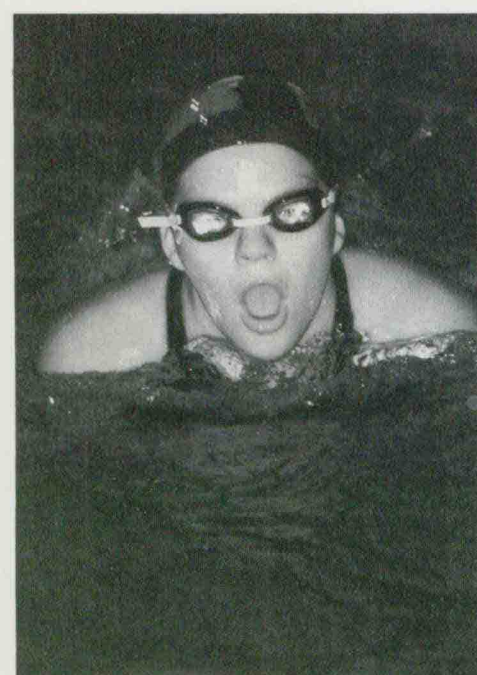

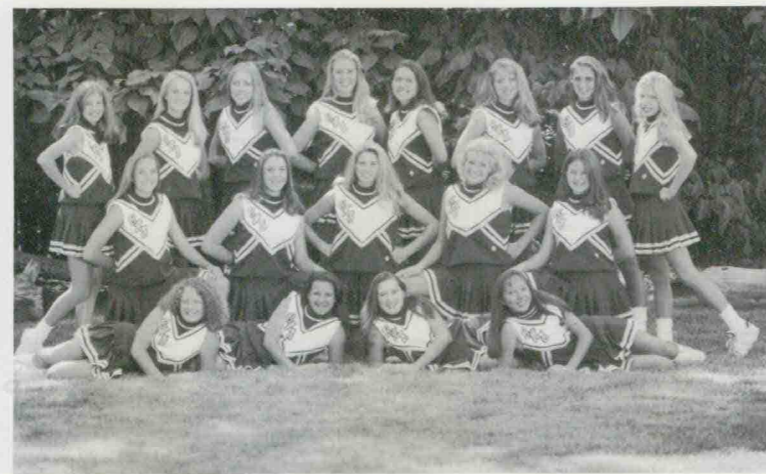

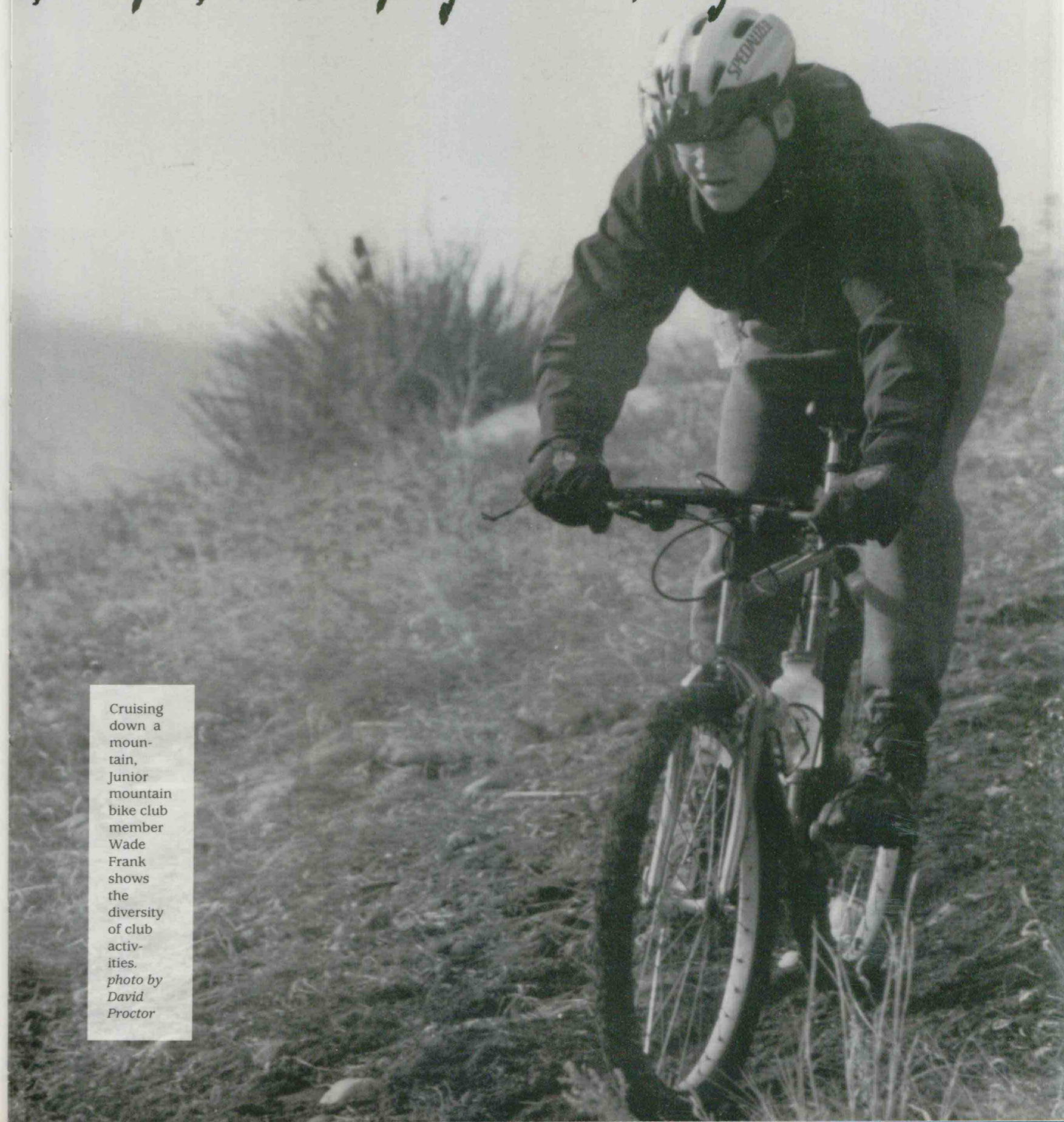

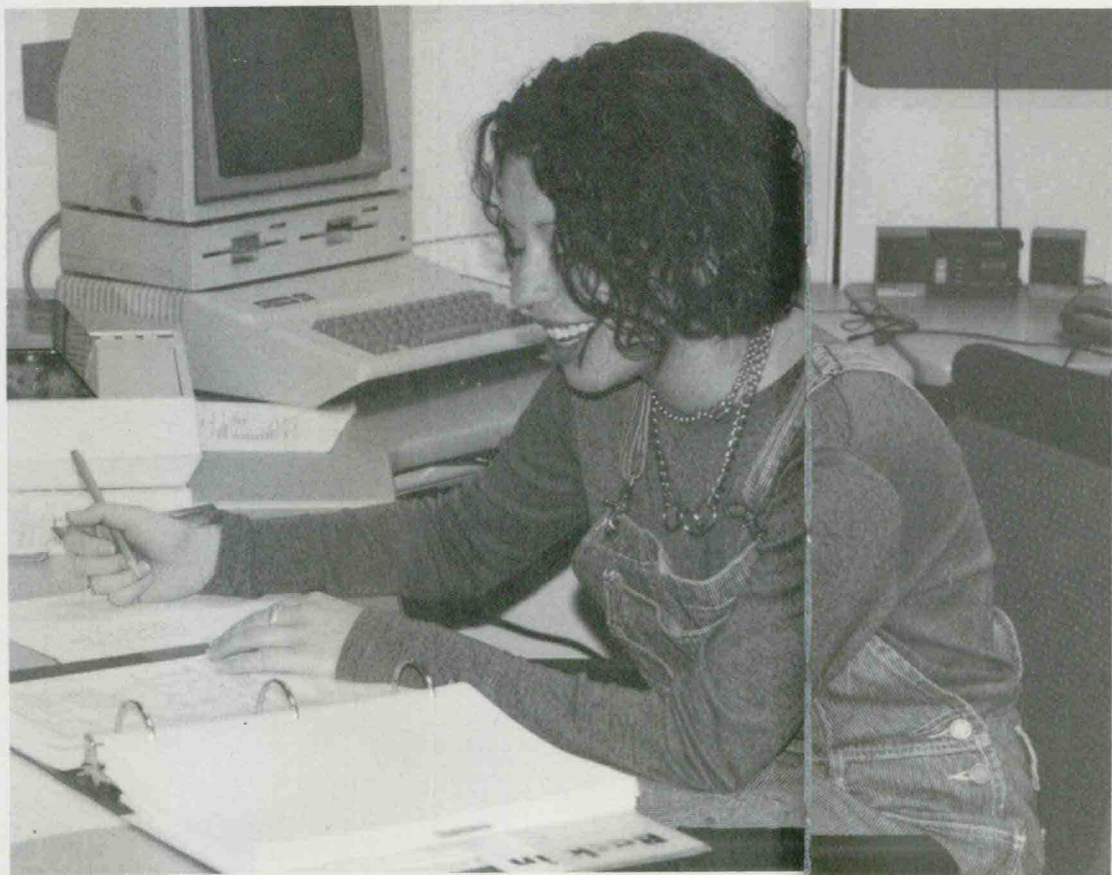

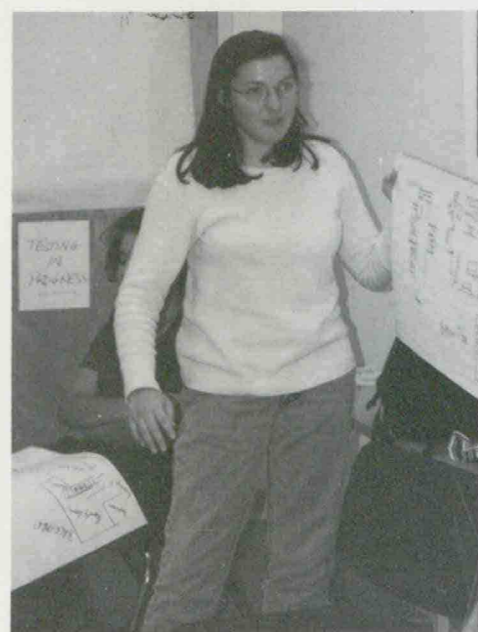

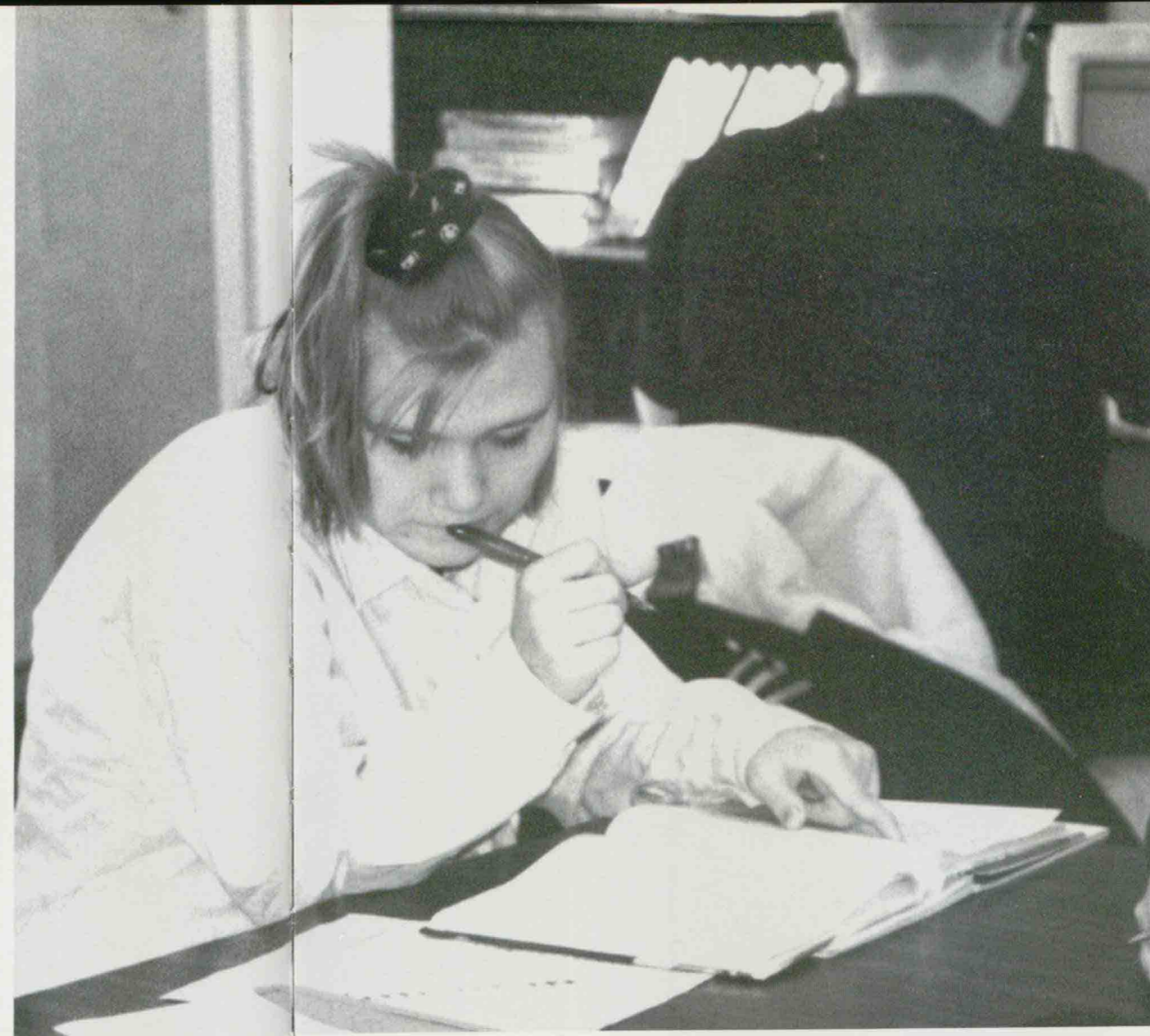
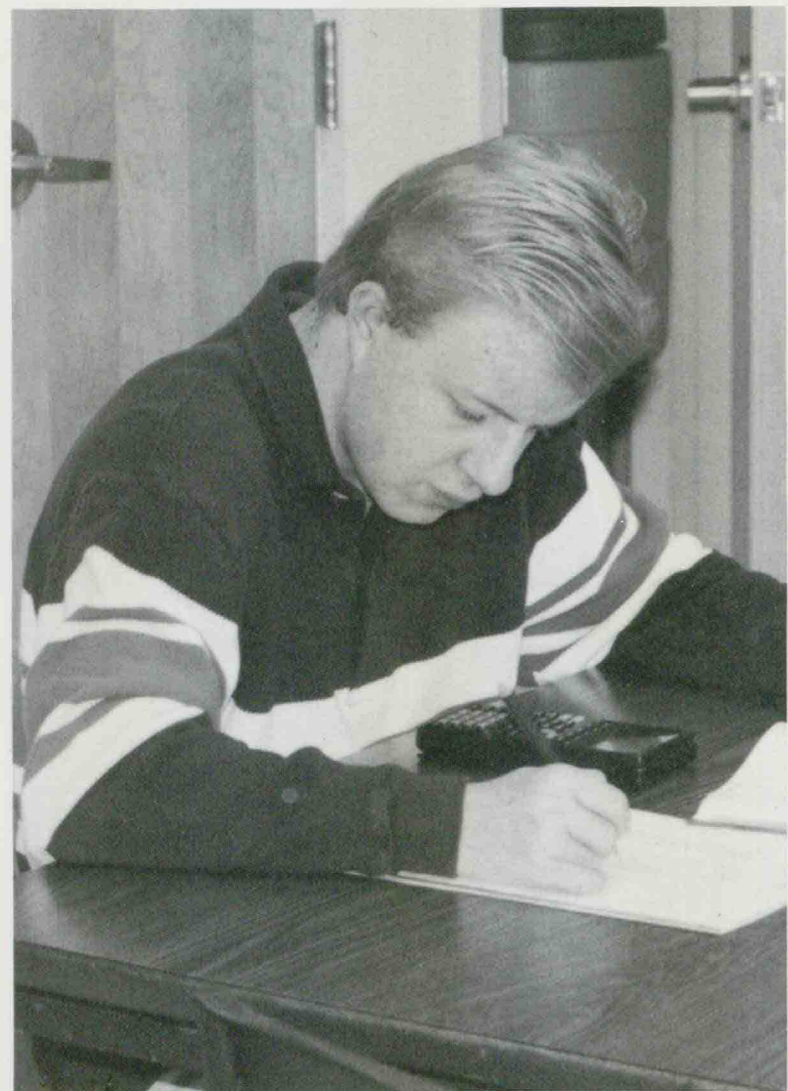
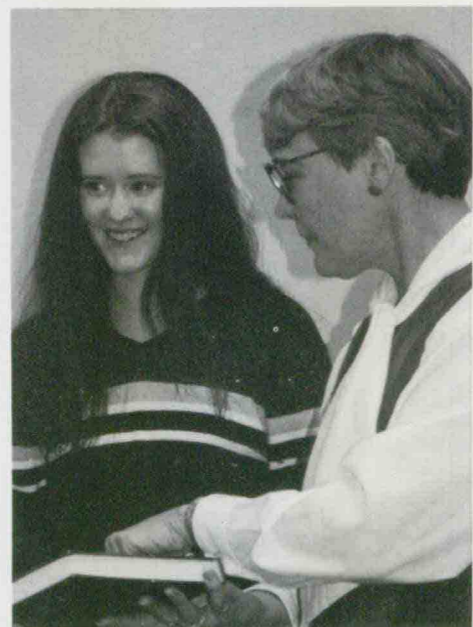
Cooking Up Success

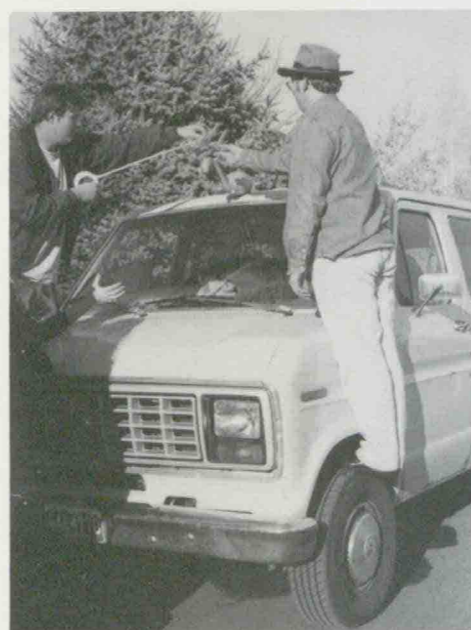

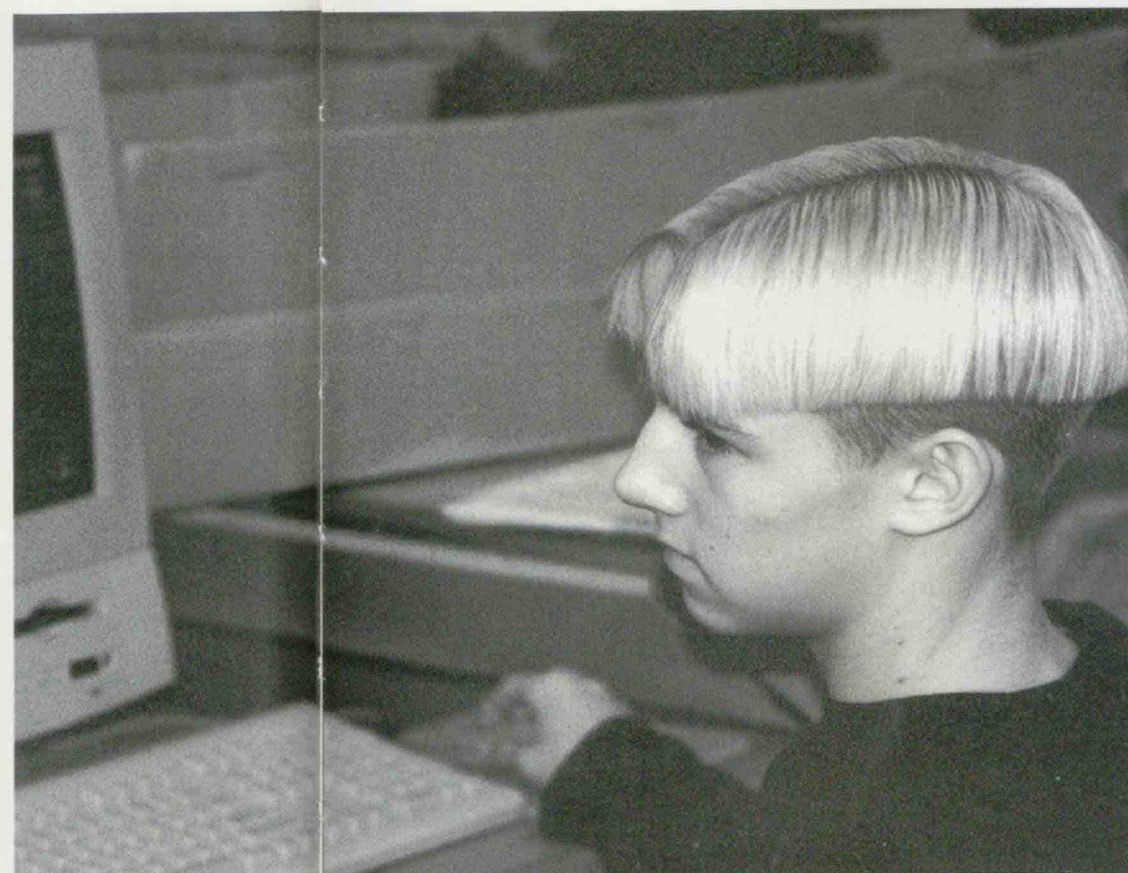
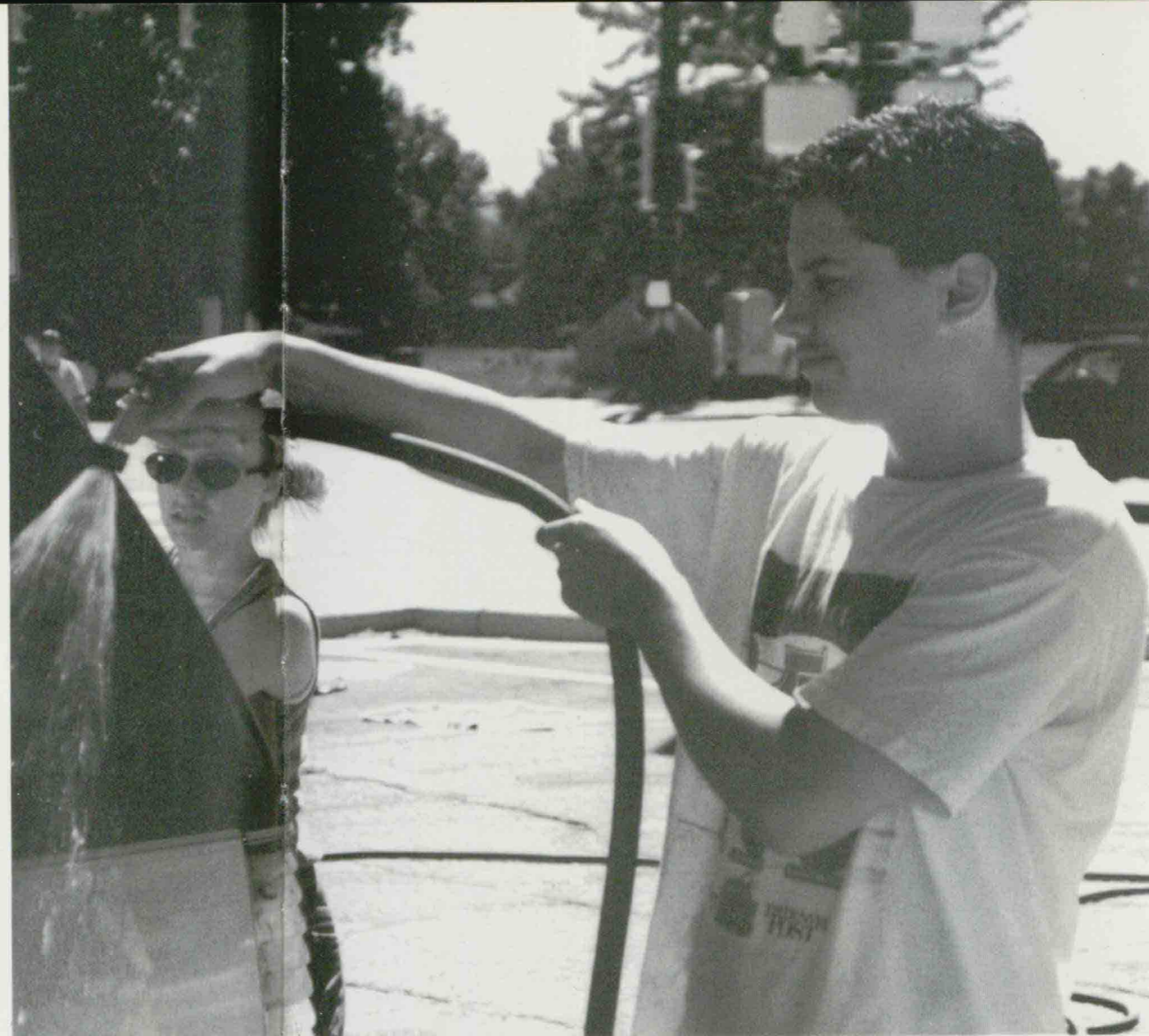
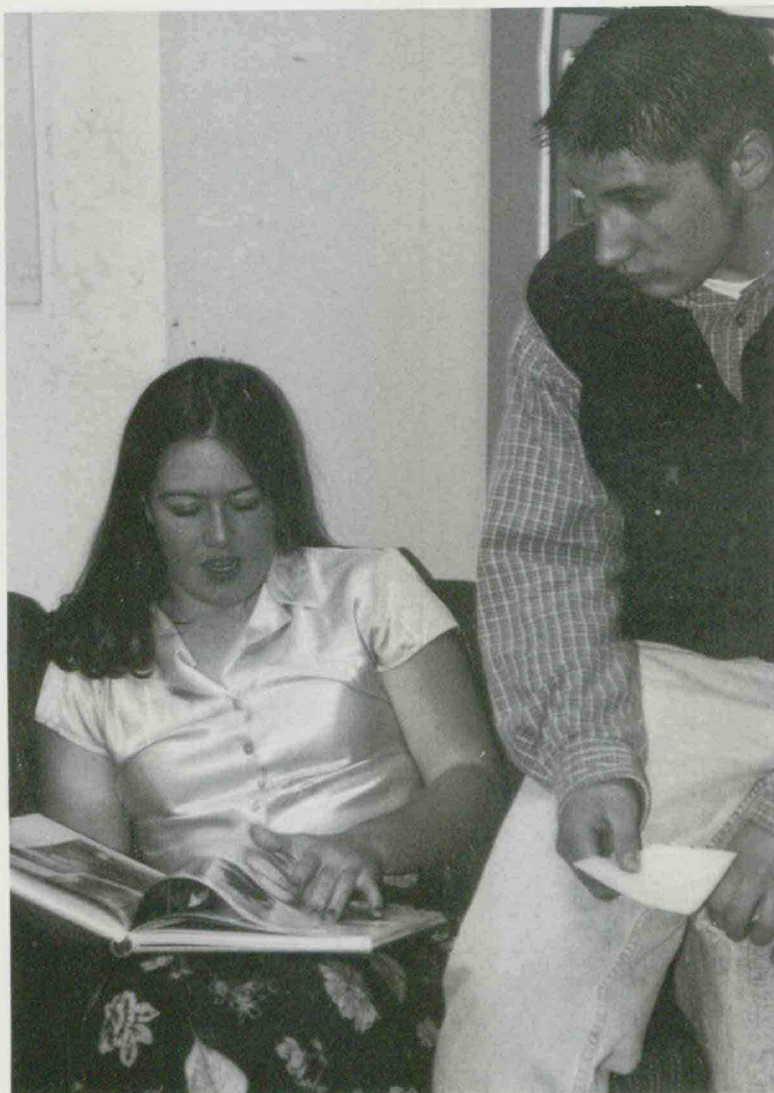
We Report, U Decide

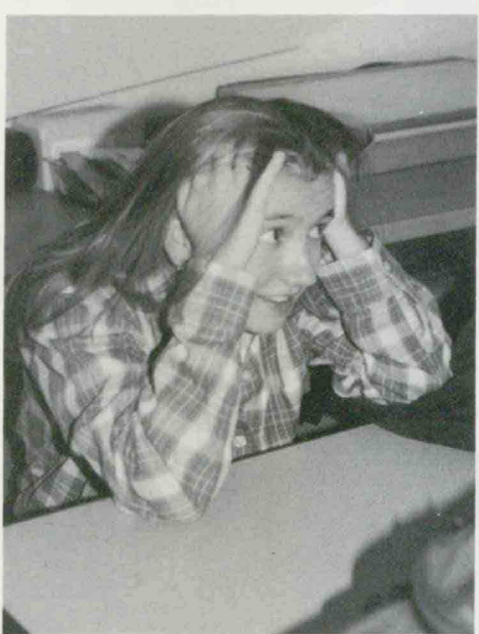

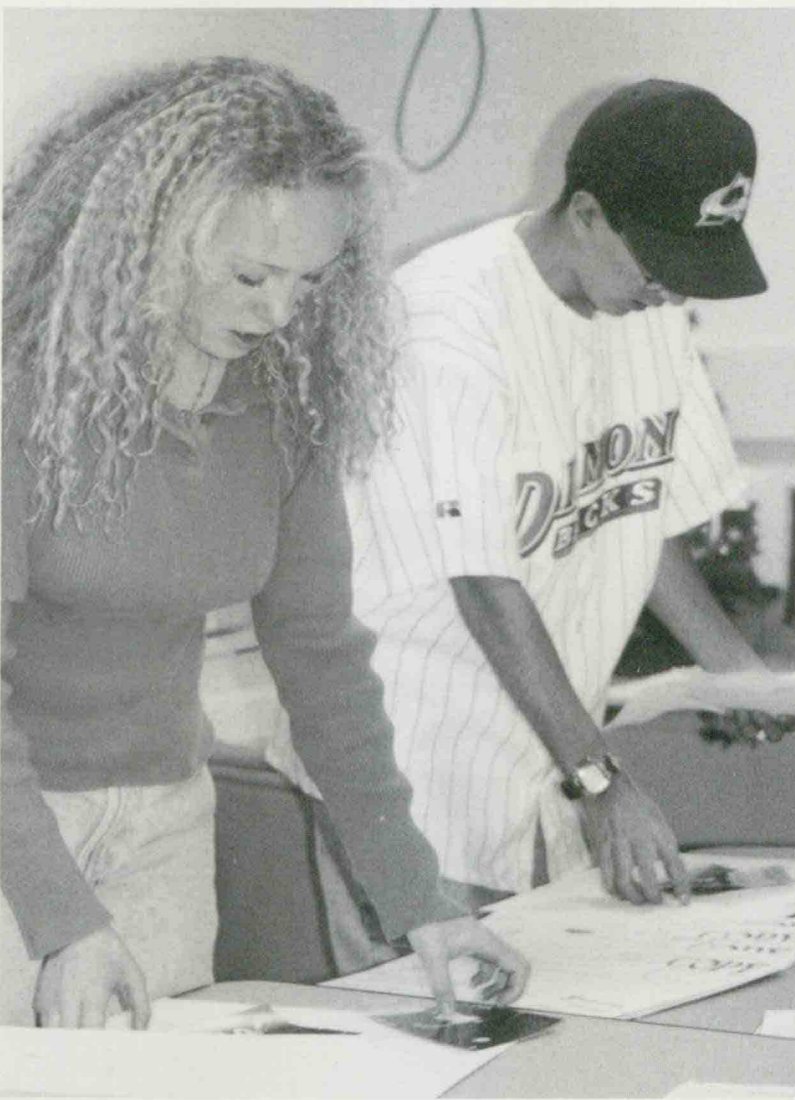

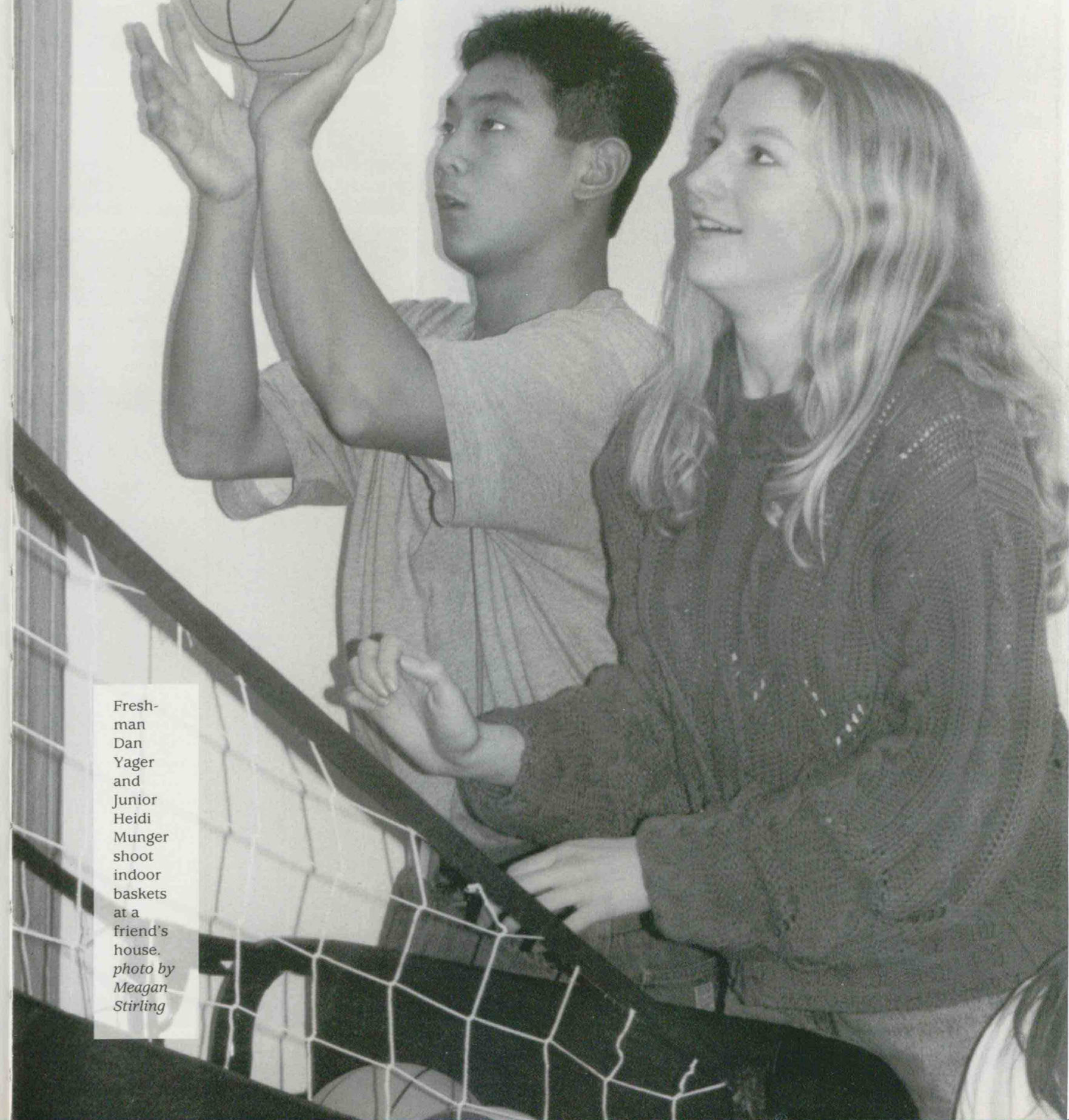

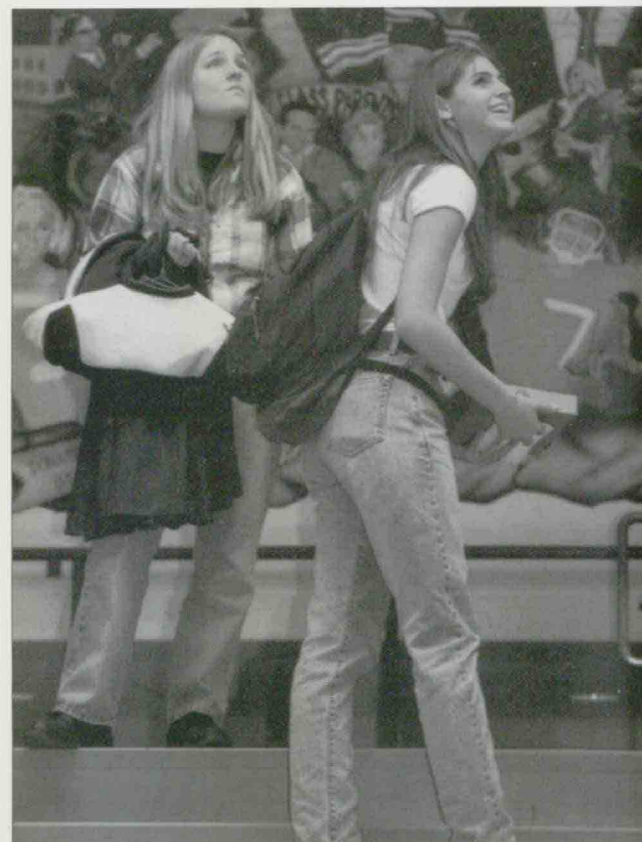

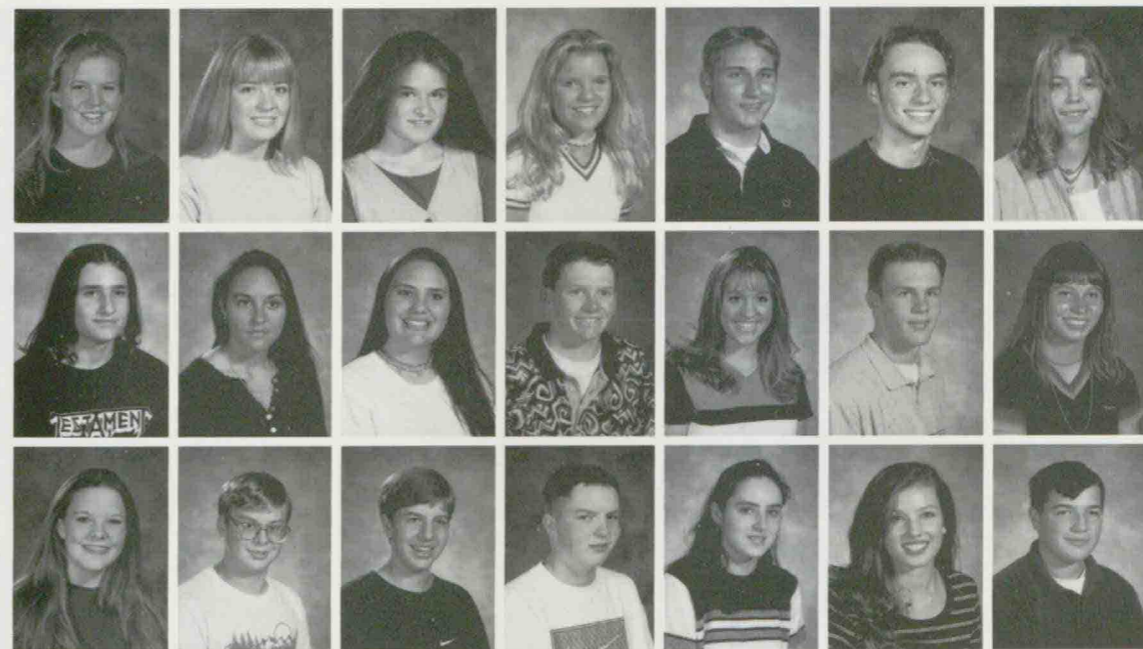

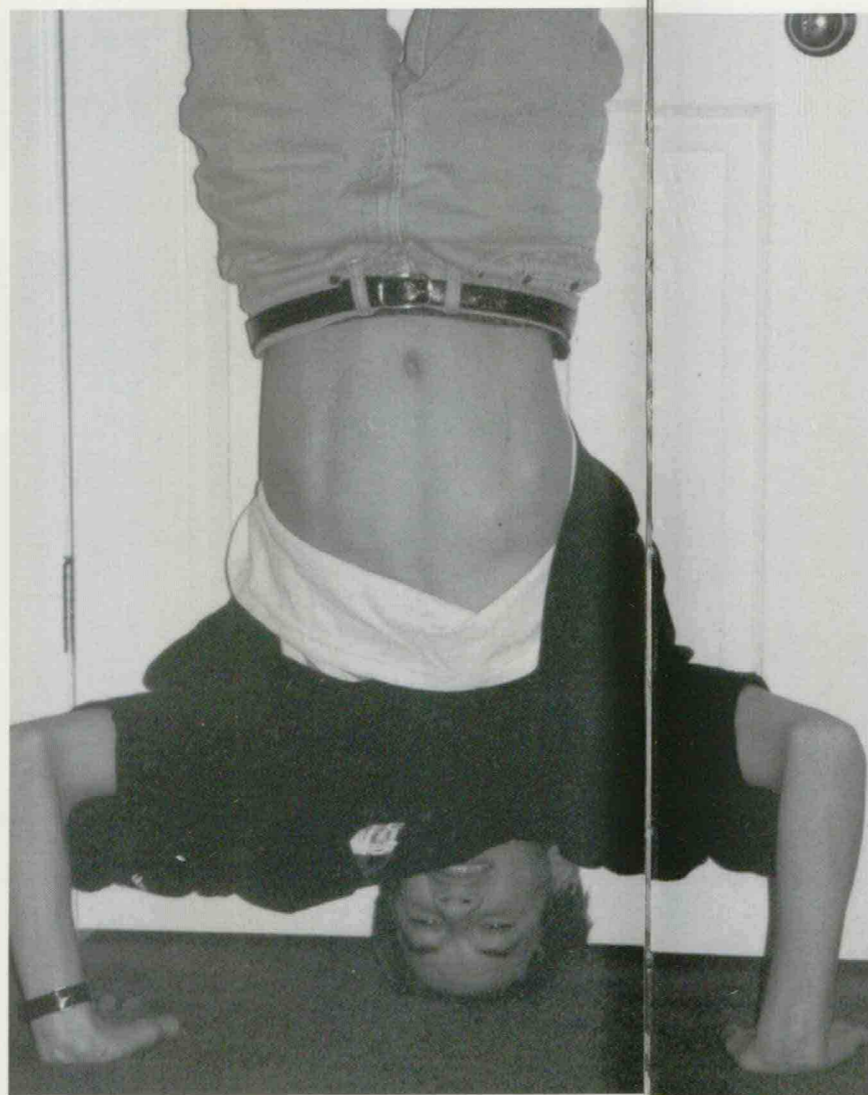

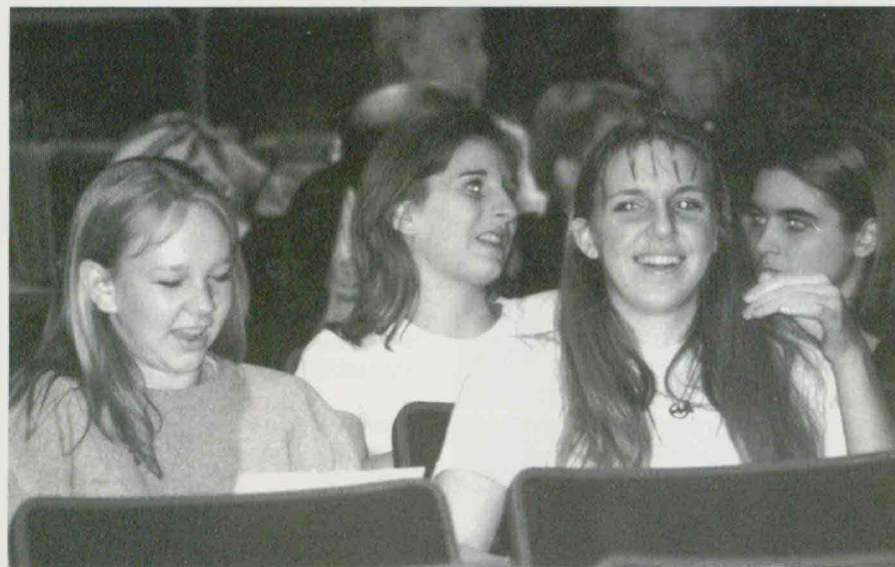

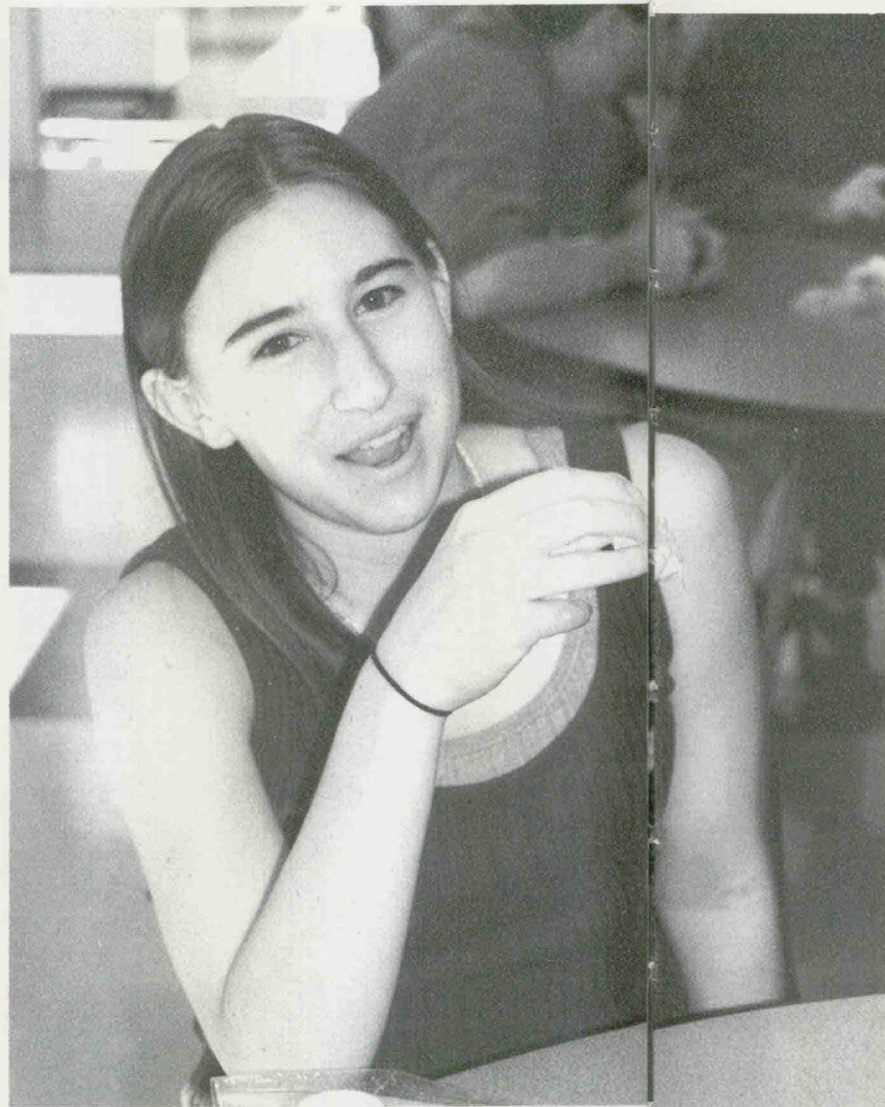

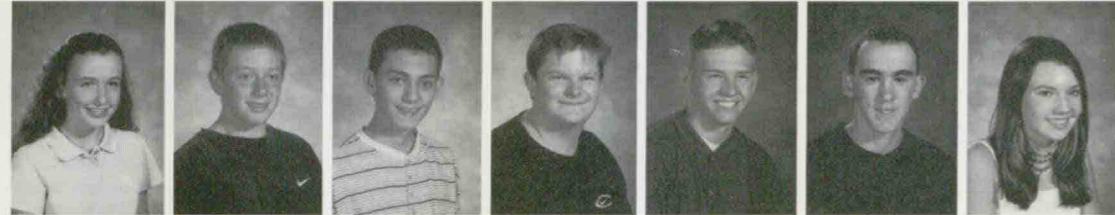

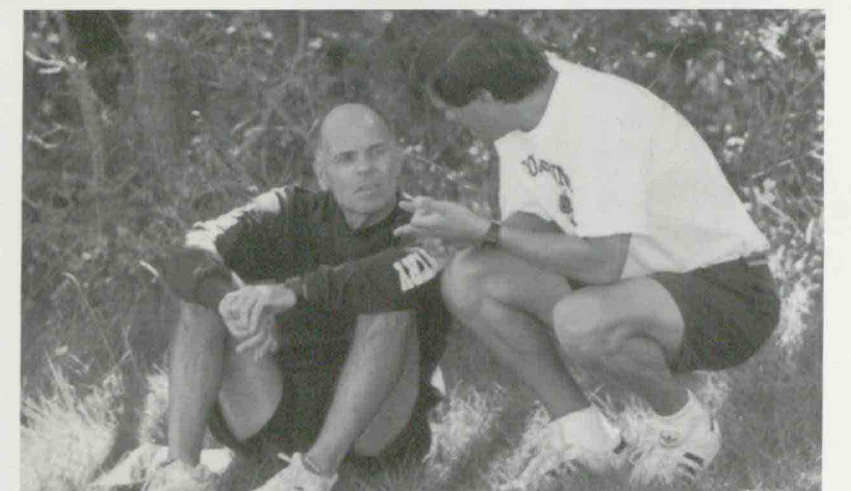

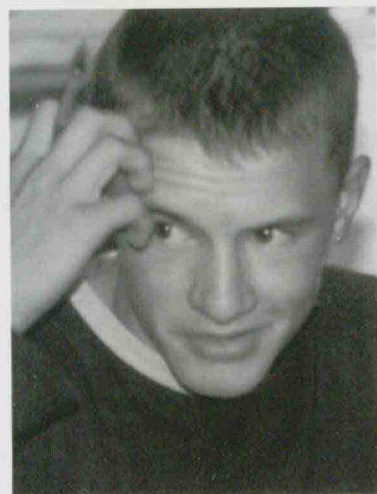

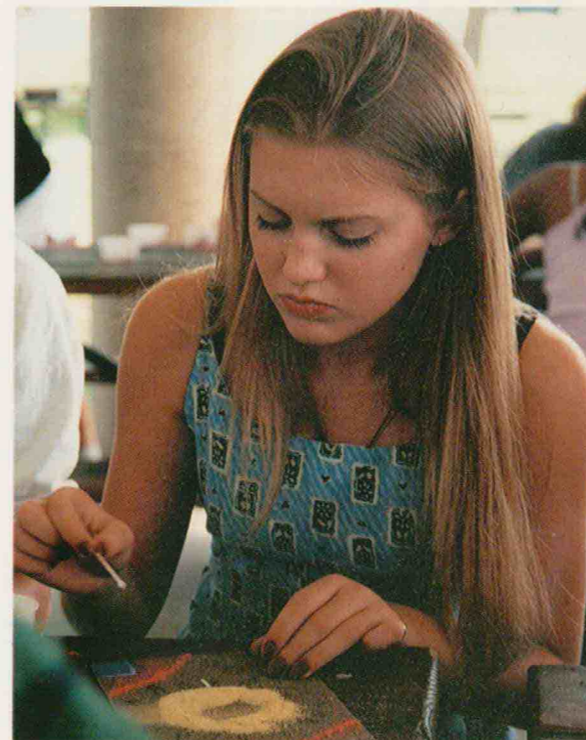

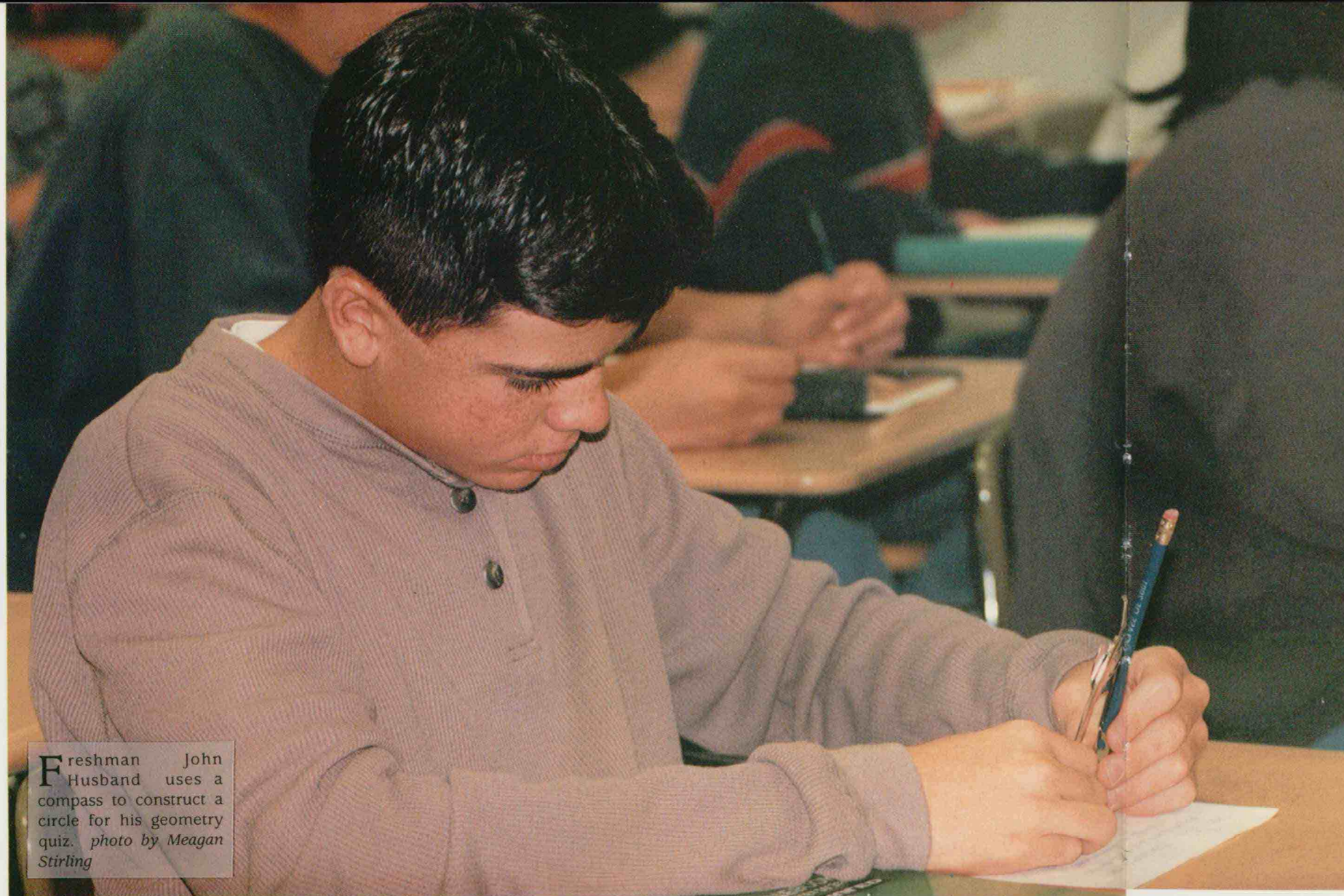

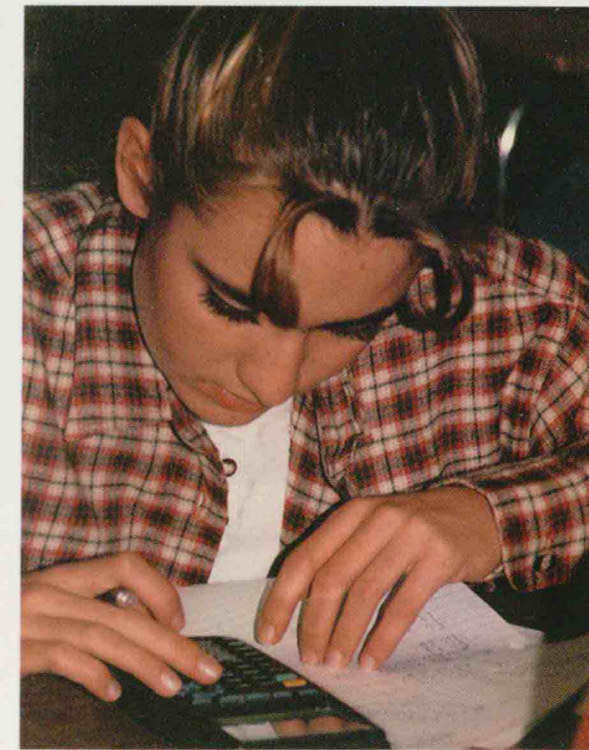

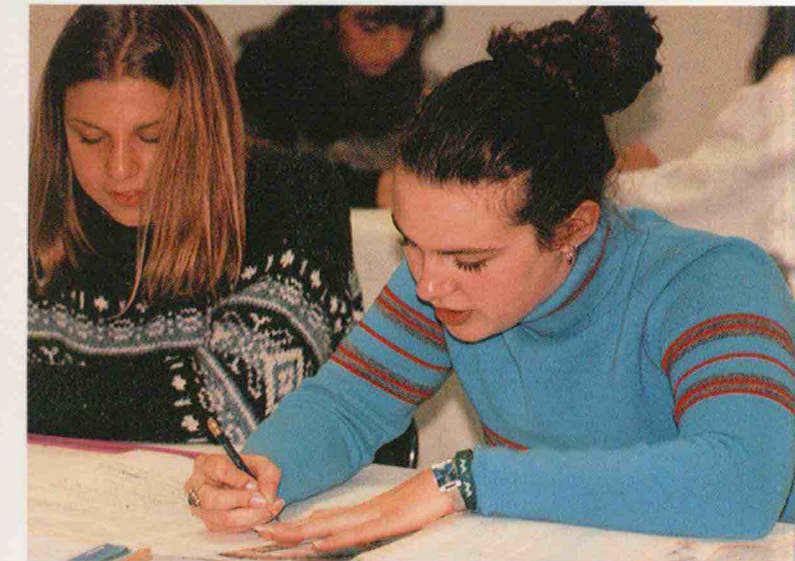

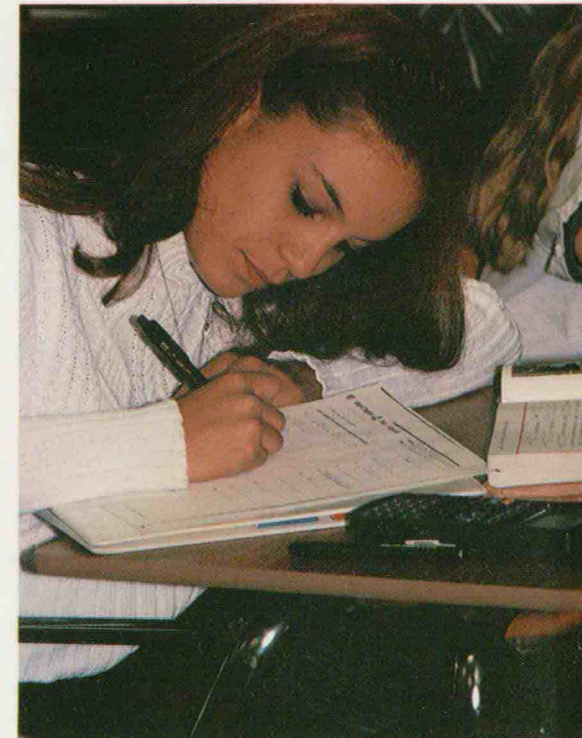

Mathematics classes provided students with logical and linear thinking skills. One new program helped more students gain these skills than ever before. The Interactive Mathematics Program (IMP), now in its third year, taught the curriculum of traditional math courses (Geometry, Algebra I and II, and Trigonometry) in a nontraditional manner. Students used math to solve real-life word problems instead of simply doing repetitive exercises from a textbook. "Most of the learning happens in the classroom," said Junior Brooks Brown, because working in groups and cooperation is highly stressed. Another new facet IMP brings to math is real-world relevance. 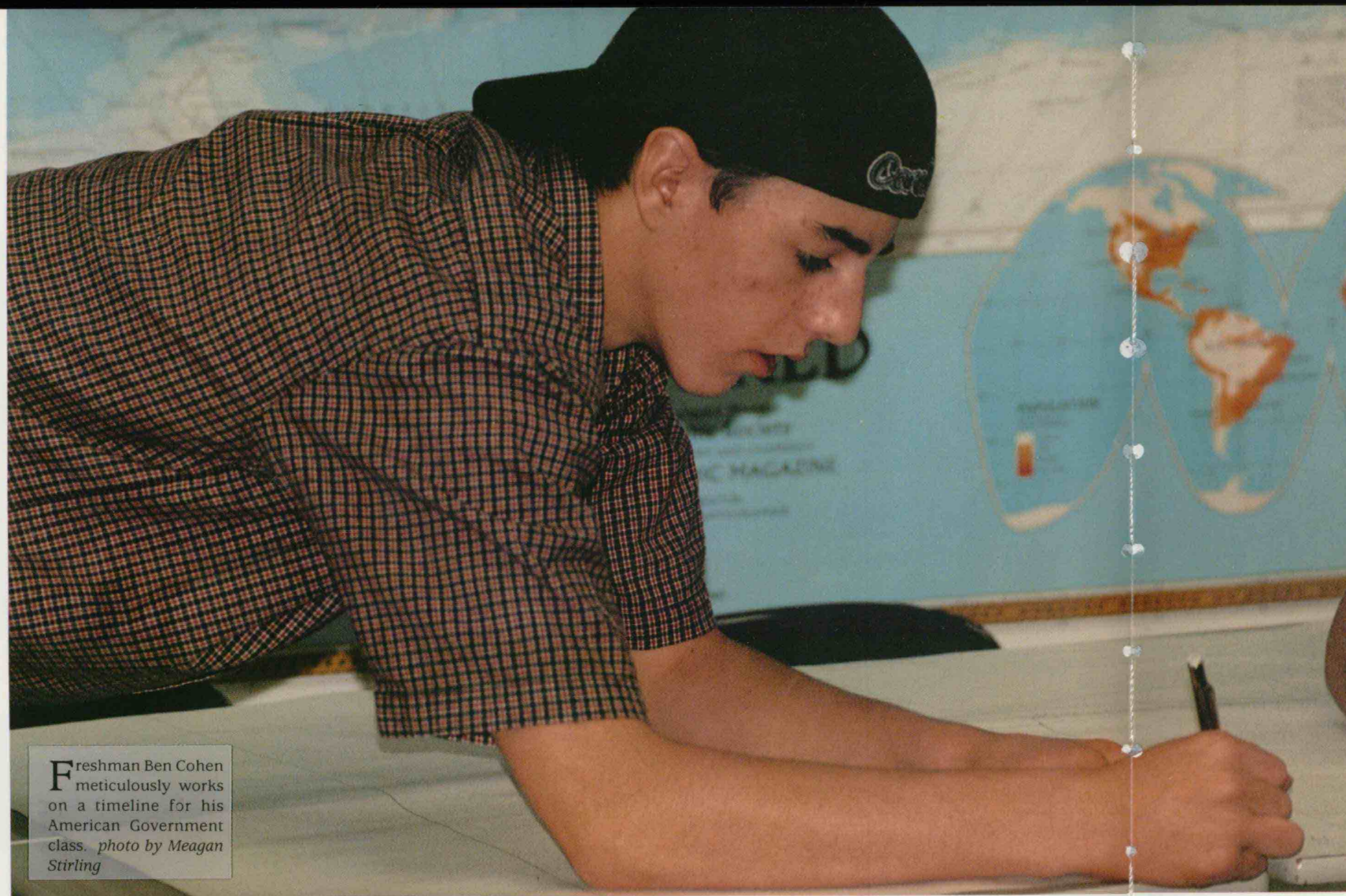

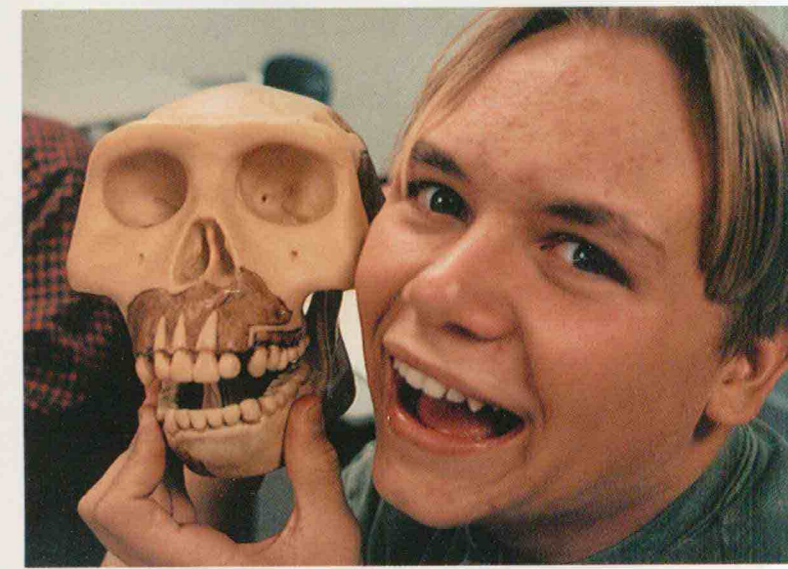

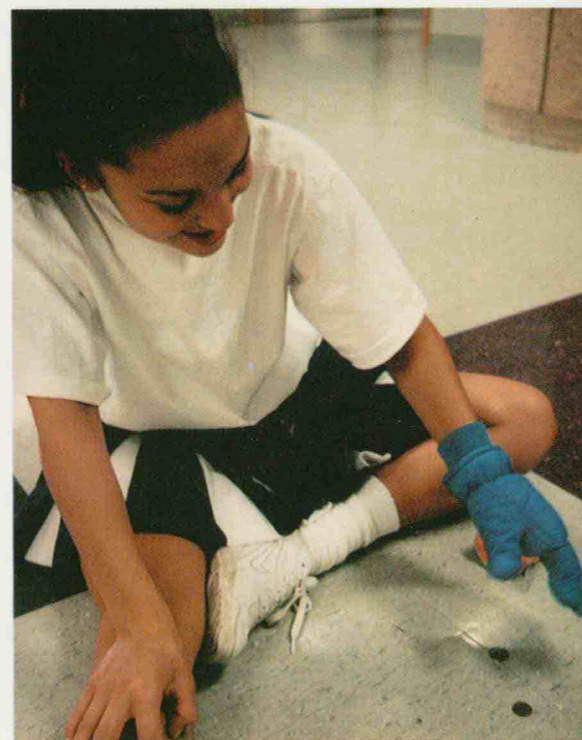

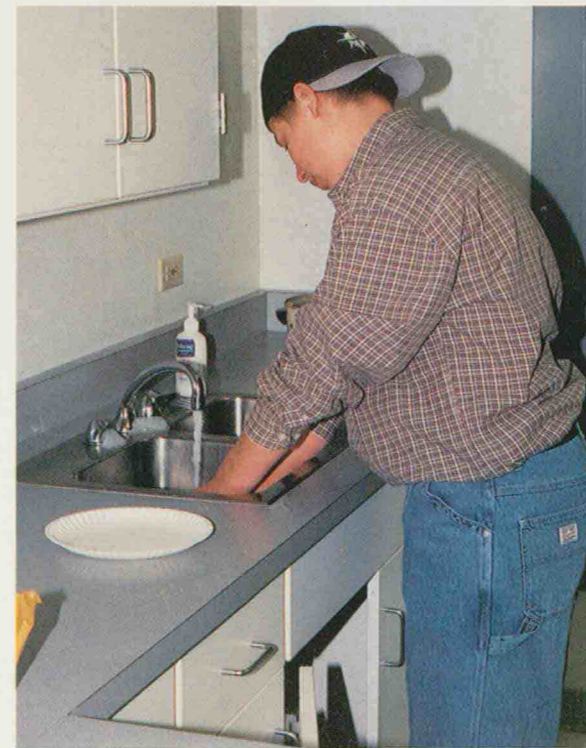

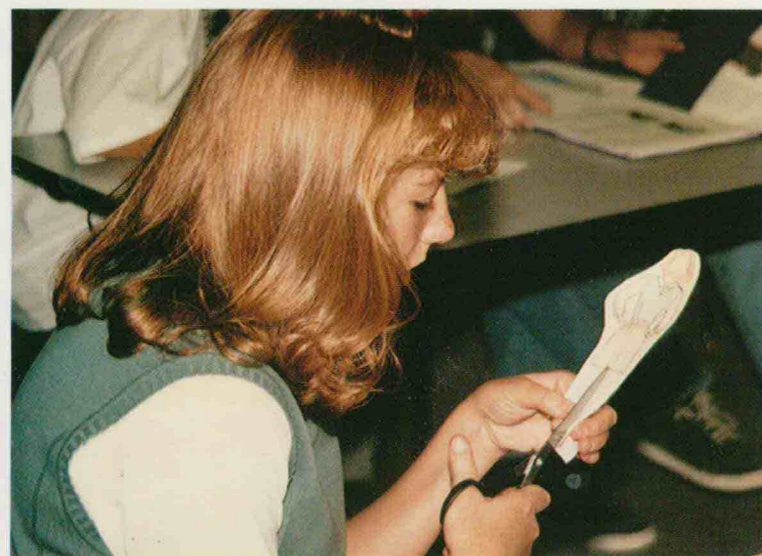

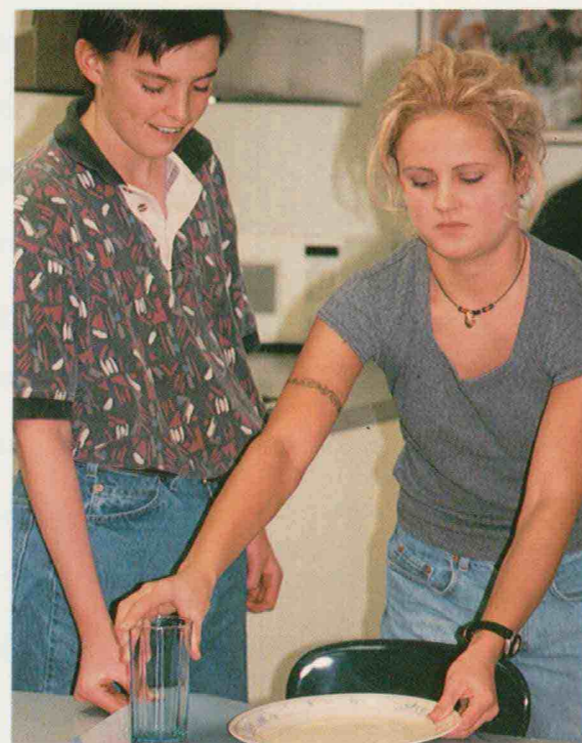

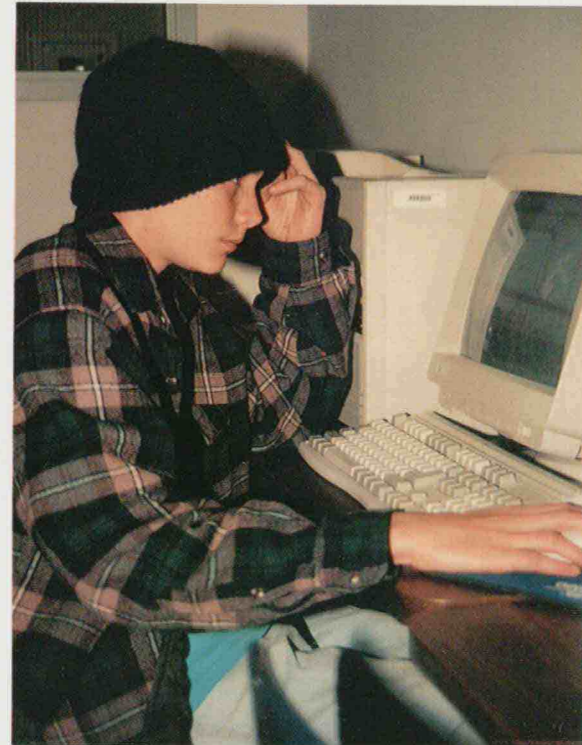

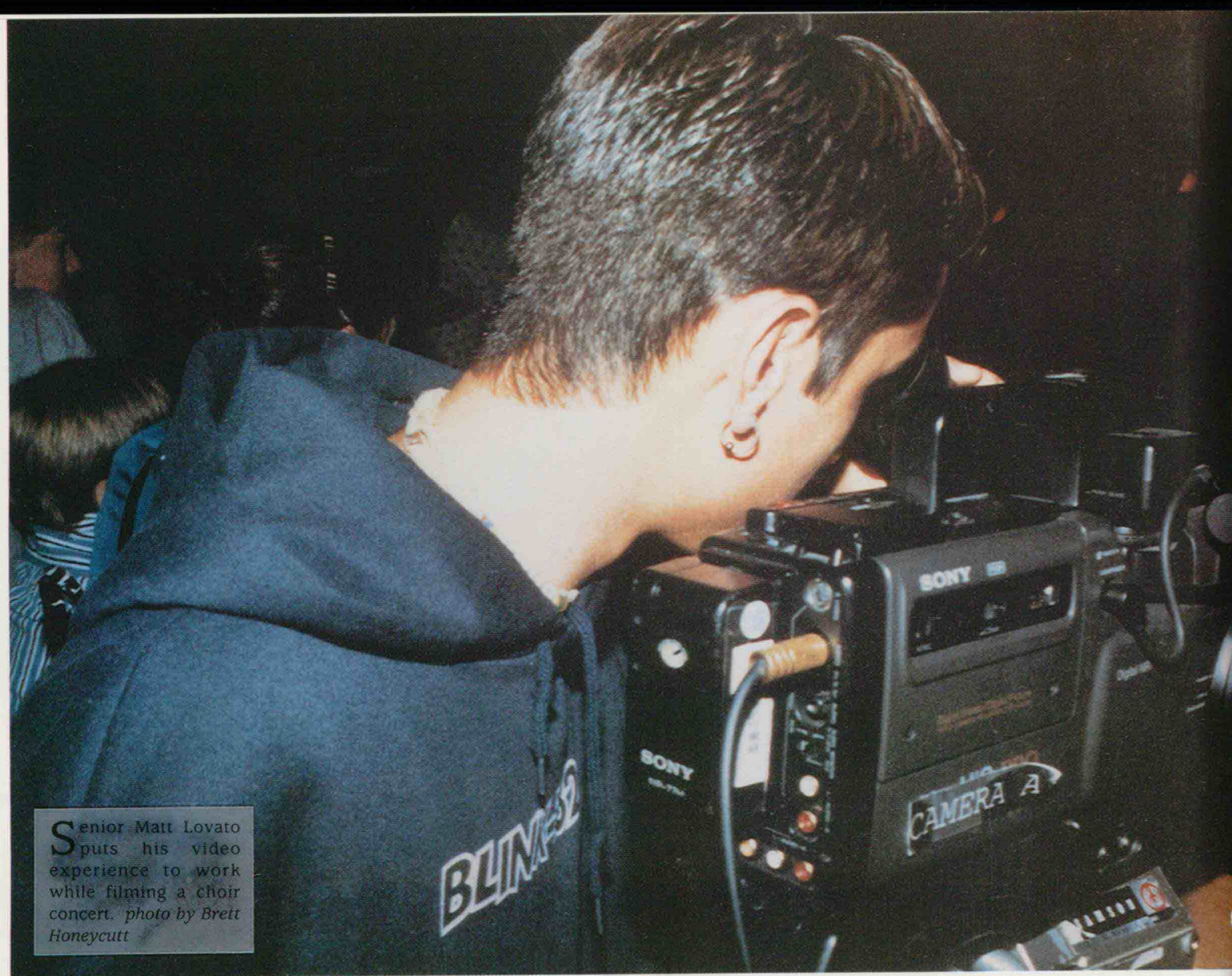

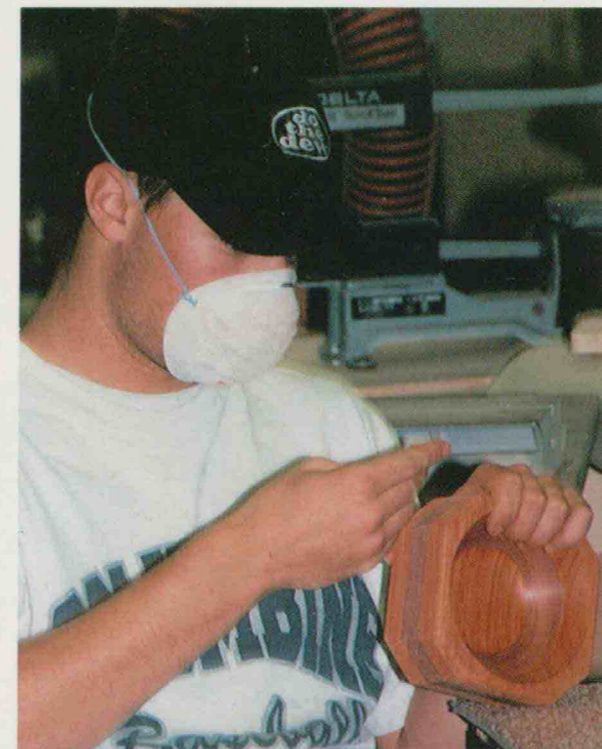

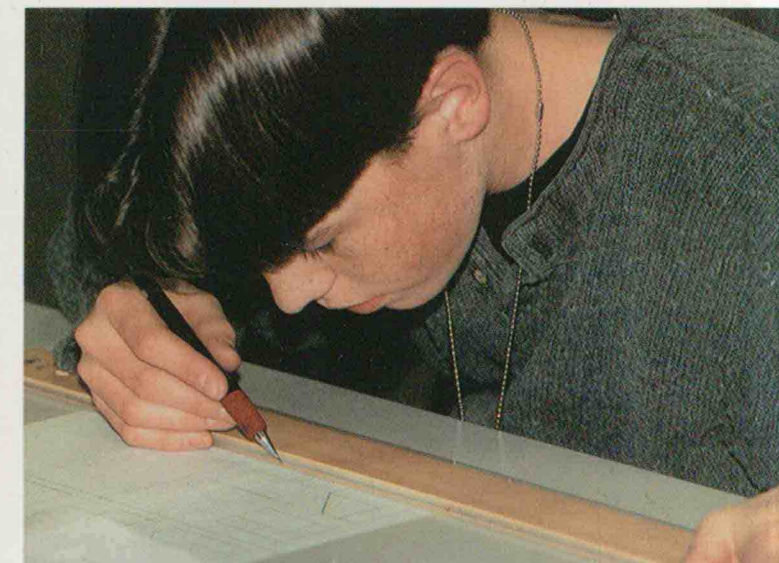

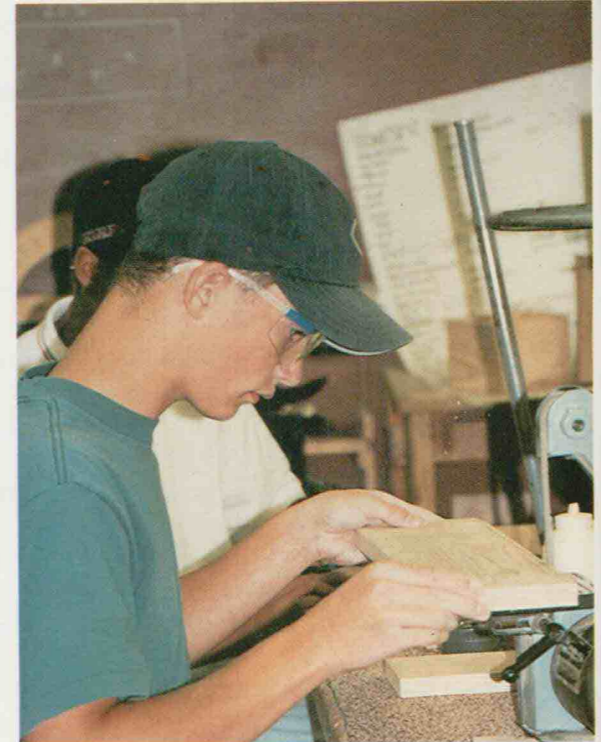

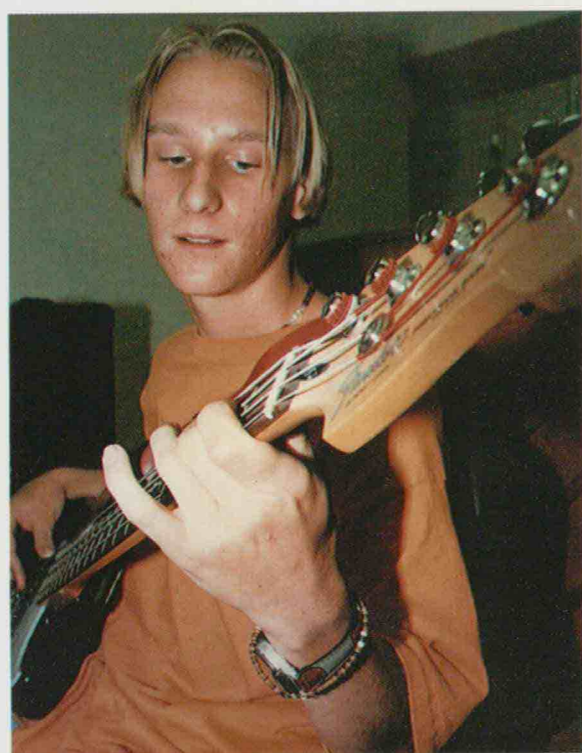

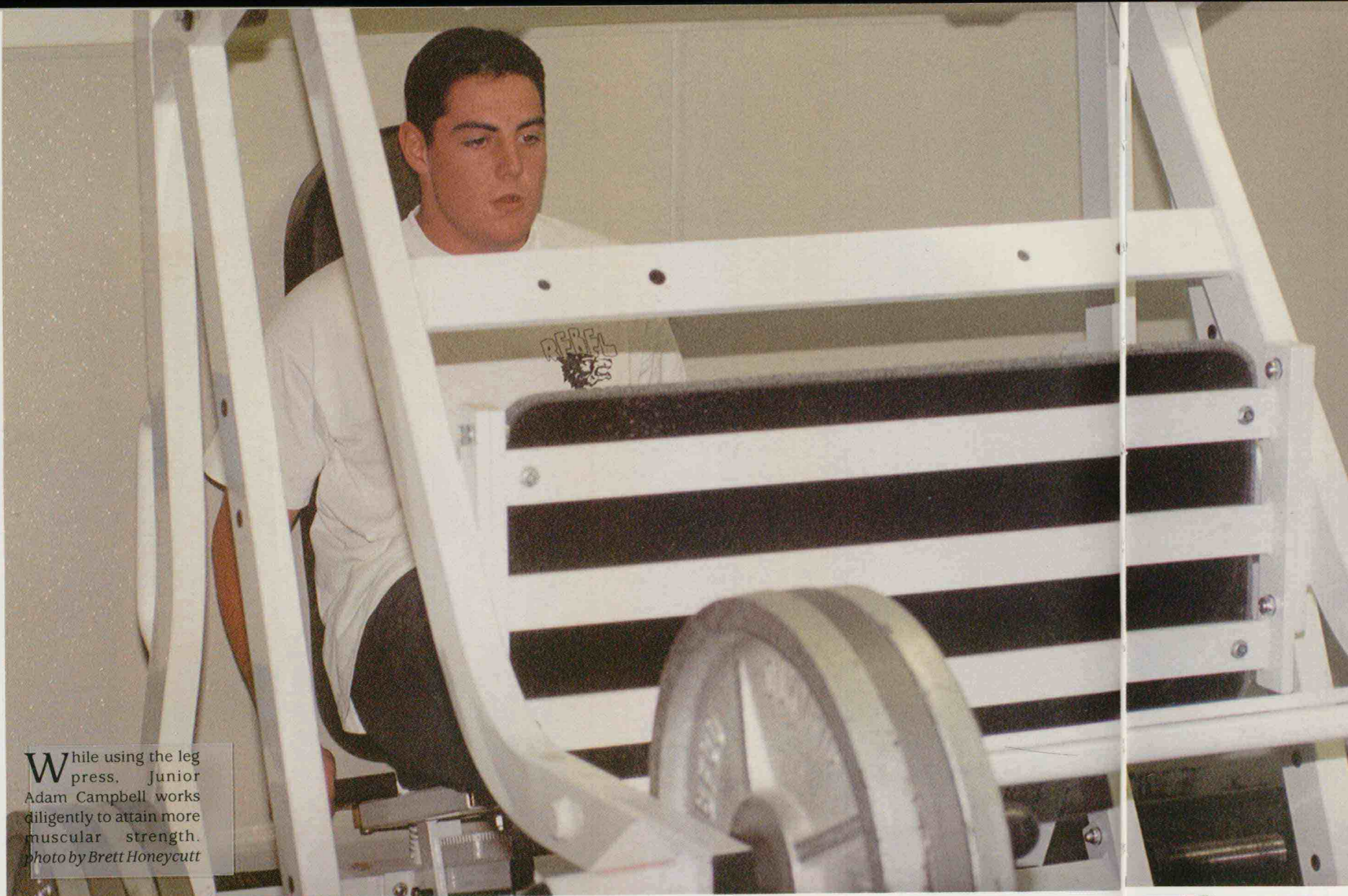

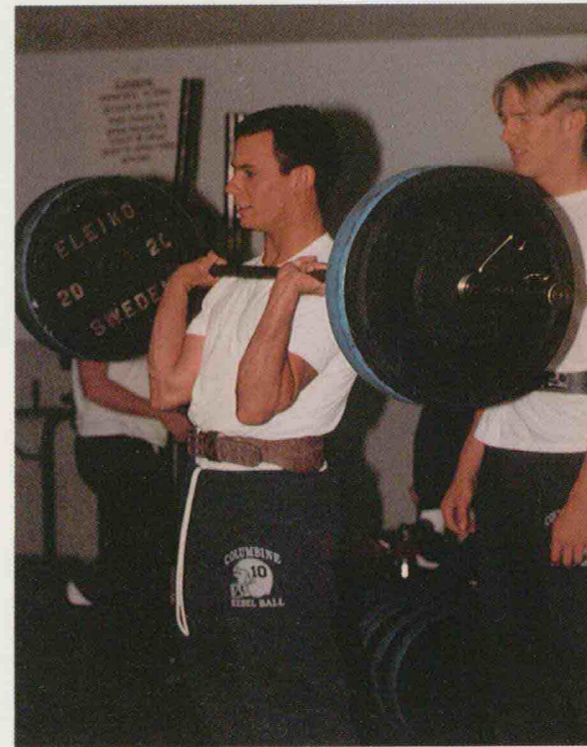

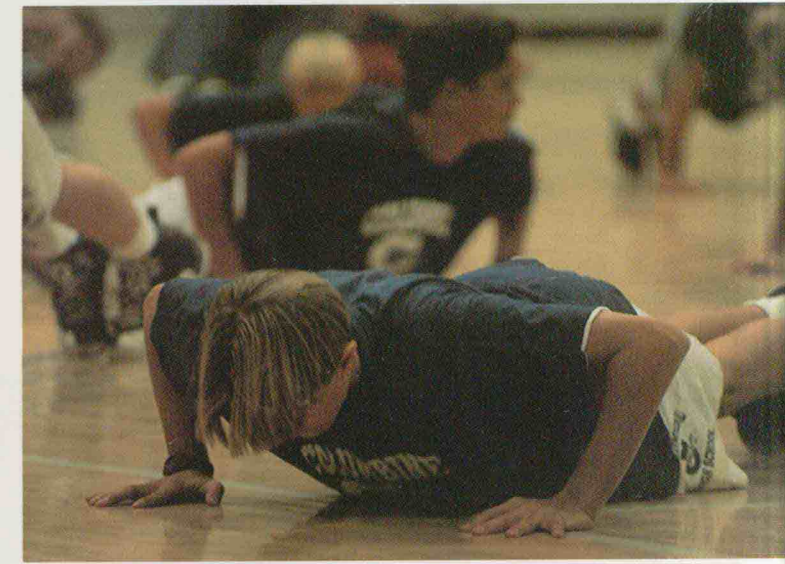

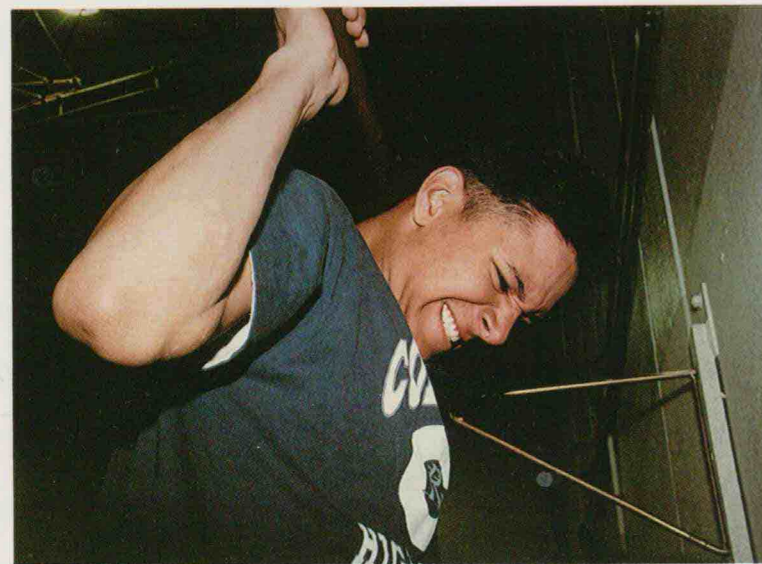
